Want to put sunshine in your meals? Then try these salads

**Tuna Salad Mold**

1 tsp. (1 envelope) unflavored gelatine, ¼ cup cold water, cup hot water, 2 tsp. lemon juice, 1 tsp. prepared mustard, ¼ tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. paprika, two 7-ounce cans tuna, flaked, 1 cup chopped celery, ½ cup heavy cream, whipped. Soften gelatine in cold water; dissolve in hot water. Add lemon juice and seasonings. Chill until partially set; add tuna and celery; fold in whipped cream. Chill in individual molds. Serves six. Or double the recipe to fill 8½x4½ inch pan. Unmold on cool platter. Garnish top with lemon slices. Overlap slices of tomato on each side of loaf, and at each corner of platter place a cucumber tulip filled with cucumber dressing.

Cucumber tulips: Cut each cucumber in 3-inch lengths. Notch tops in 5 or 6 petals. Remove some of center with spoon.

Cucumber dressing: Combine ½ cup mayonnaise, ¼ cup finely diced cucumber, 1 tsp. chopped green pepper, 1 tsp. tarragon vinegar; ¼ tsp. salt, dash cayenne pepper.

**Two Decker Salad**

Top deck: Put cool canned peach halves (drain thoroughly) together with a mixture of cream cheese softened with a little cream, chopped dates, and nuts. Arrange stuffed peaches on lettuce. Around them arrange whole strawberries or maraschino cherries on the stem and slices of avocado dipped in lemon juice. Tuck in some sprigs of parsley too.

Lower deck: Arrange crisp cool wedges of lettuce on ruffly lettuce. Spoon thousand island dressing over. Between the lettuce wedges, arrange deviled eggs and tomato quarters. A very pretty dish.
