

Kelly's Error Allows Roush to Tie Score to Tie Score

New York Breaks Tie in Seventh When Frisch Triples, Only to Have Cincinnati Win Out in Last Half.

CINCINNATI, July 21.—Cincinnati won one of the hardest fought battles of the season from New York today, 8 to 7, in 11 innings. Watson was knocked out in the first round, but Neph pitched well, and Luque allowed a well-laid score in the seventh without a hit, on his wildness and an error by Critz.

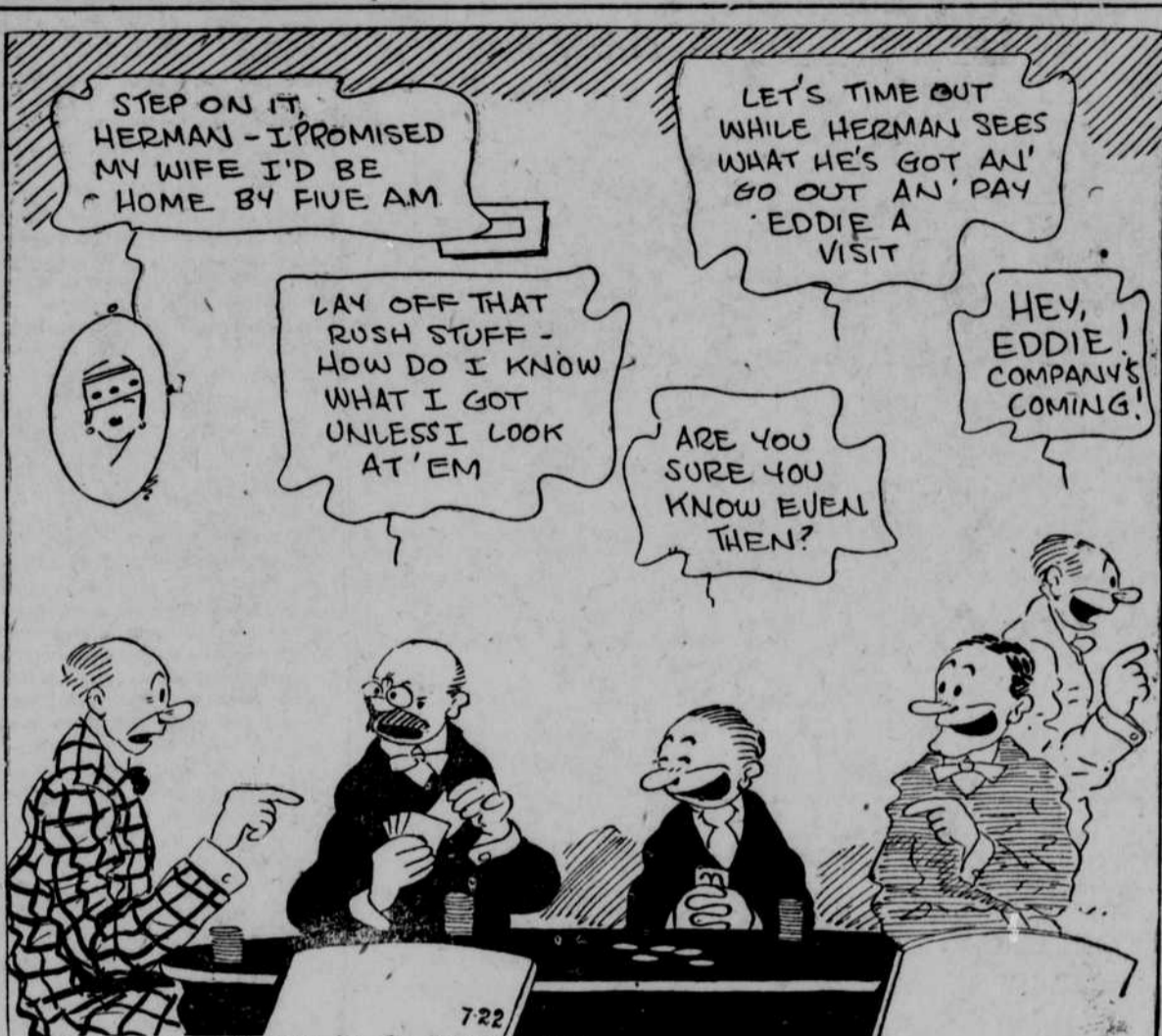
In the ninth New York scored three runs off May on three hits and an error by Roush, but the Reds tied it in their half on four hits, two passed and a wild pitch by Bentley. In the eleventh the Giants scored a run on Frisch's triple and a single by Kelly, the first time Rixey had been scored on in 34 innings. In the last half of the eleventh Roush reached third on a pass, a balk by Jonnard and an out. With two out, Kelly took his foot off the mound before receiving Jackson's good throw on Fonseca's grounder, which would have retired the side without scoring. The error allowed Roush to score the tying run, and then Pinellut put Fonseca over with a triple to right. Thirty-nine players took part in the game, the Reds using 20 and the Giants 19.
