

Four-Day Harness Race Meeting Starts Today at Ak Track With Nine Races

Large Fields to Face Starter in Each Event

More Than 125 Harness Horses, Best in This Section of Country at Ak Track for Meet.

WITH more than 125 harness horses on the grounds waiting for the word to go, the annual harness race meeting of King Ak-Sar-Ben will open this afternoon when nine races pry off the lid.

Not one stone has been left unturned in preparation for the short meeting. One of the surprising facts of the meet is the large number and class of trotters and pacers that are munched out at Ak-Sar-Ben field preparatory to starting in the events. Each race is well filled with entries and many of the harness horses are well-known to Omahans. Several have raced on the best half mile and mile tracks of the country and several have mile records are sported by these.

Charlie Trimble, secretary of the Ak-Sar-Ben race meetings, both running and harness, has gotten together what he believes will be four good afternoon programs of racing. With Dr. W. A. Matthews in charge of the starting and N. J. Ronin, president judge assisted by Perry Reed, the short meeting is bound to go off in grand style.

Thirty horses, 12 trotters and 18 pacers have been nominated for the opening day events this afternoon. Three races are scheduled, but each race consists of three heats and each heat is considered a race, therefore there will be nine races on which the pari-mutuels will click off numbers.

Another interesting feature about this harness meeting is that no races are a mile or over. All events will be shorter than one mile so that the time clocked up by each winner will not go on that trotter or pacer's record. This is bound to bring out stronger competition in each heat.

The 2:22 trot over three-quarters of a mile is the first race on the afternoon's program. Twelve trotters have been nominated for the \$500 purse. This should develop three mighty interesting heats with such trotters as Rags, Ed Peterson's entry; Minnie Azoff of the "Tuck" Conly stable; Czar Brook of D. W. McLaughlin's stable and Ivan Porter, son of the great Ivan the Great. The latter is owned by J. L. Bagby of Topeka, Kan., entered.

The entry list in the second race, the 2:17 pace for seven-eighths of a mile was so large that the event had to be raced in two divisions with 10 side-wheelers in the first division and eight in the second. Three heats will make up each race and each heat will be a race.

Billy Mack, O. C. Machurek's pacer and Dorothy Brown from the J. H. Shire stables of Valley Falls, Kan., are bound to be up close when time comes to award the prize money. Irene Strathmore and Silver Wilkes, also Silver Hal have to be reckoned with in the first division of the 2:17 pace.

The second division of the 2:17 pace will bring together eight of the best side-wheelers at Ak track. Verawanna, Ed Peterson's star with Roy Owen in the buggy will probably be installed the favorite, although Teddy Jr., with McDonald in the sulky and Don The Orphan from R. L. Parker's stable of St. Paul should give a good account of themselves.

The first race of the afternoon will start at 2 o'clock.
