Mary Carr Appears Twice.
Mary Carr, long known for her exquisite portrayal of mother roles, and who again plays the mother in a rural family in the photoplay at the Moon, "The Spirit of the U. S. A.," has blossomed into a full fledged society matron and does some splendid work in "For Sale," the society drama at the Rialto.
One has grown so accustomed to seeing her in the habiliments of poverty that it was at first a shock and then a pleasure, because she looks well and does her work to perfection. We should like to see her in more such roles. In "The Spirit of the U. S. A.," she co-stars with Johnnie Walker again for the first time since "Over the Hill," which made them both famous.

The film is in every sense a sob story, but is wonderfully acted and equally well directed. However, Manager Cunningham strives to leave a good taste in your mouth and let you leave laughing, by showing Dorothy Devore in "Hold Your Breath," a Christie feature comedy of the "guaranteed to tickle your ribs" kind.
