## Yankee Polo Team Chosen

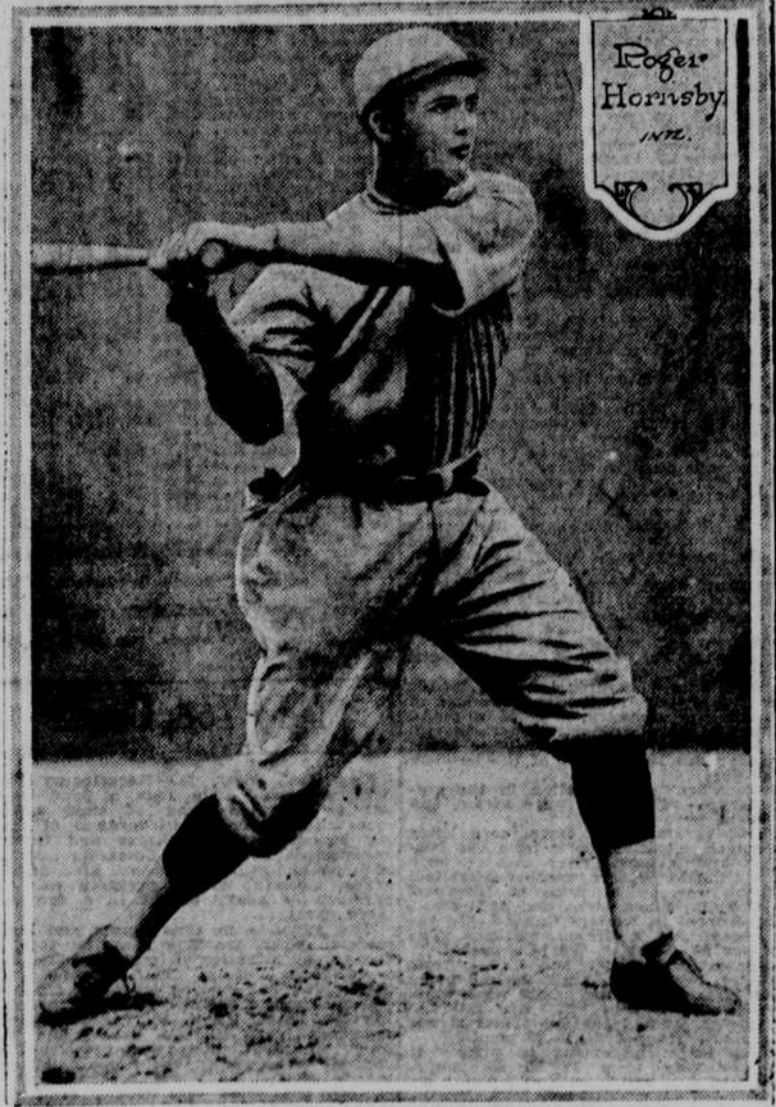
