

Sixth Mate Is Sued by Widow of Hanged Man

Two Other Previous Husbands in Prison; Present One Now in County Jail.

Mattie Griggs filed suit in district court Saturday for a divorce from Frank W. Griggs, who is now serving a sentence in the county jail for beating her.

Mrs. Griggs informed her attorney, Frank Yates, that she is the widow of Eugene Weeks, who was hanged in Des Moines September 18, 1922, for the murder of a grocer there.

Married When 12.

The testimony at that trial disclosed her very bad luck in the matrimonial game. She testified that her first husband, to whom she was married at the age of 12, is in the Missouri penitentiary for life for murder.

She divorced his successor. Her third was sent to the penitentiary for 17 years for horse stealing.

No. 4 was the unfortunate Weeks. She alleges he once tied her up and then cut her with razors and knives. She says he knocked out four of her teeth and blackened both her eyes. He sold her automobile and now has the proceeds, \$350, in the county jail. She asks that this be returned to her.

Mrs. Griggs now resides at 1617 Burt street. Clad in a wrapper she responded to a ring at the doorbell, but intimated that her matrimonial affairs were not a happy subject of conversation to her.

The present divorce petition gives her name as Nettie. "My first name's Nettie and my middle name Nettie," she said.

MOTHER FIGHTS FOR 2 CHILDREN

Hans Rathman, 56, testified for his daughter, Mrs. Anne Godsey of Millard, in juvenile court Saturday. Relatives brought action to take from her her two children—Orville, 5, and Ruby, 3—on allegations that they are neglected.

"It's just a scheme to try to separate me and my husband," she declared. "My brothers-in-law are Dutch and they are against my husband because he is American."

Relatives testified that Clinton Godsey, the husband, does not provide support and that the family slept in vacant houses and under bridges.

Mrs. Olive Foster of Kansas City is visiting her son, Dr. Harry A. Foster, vice chairman of the board of public welfare.

Discussing welfare work, in which she is interested in her home city, Mrs. Foster explained that her particular work is to require lazy husbands and grown sons to assist in maintaining their homes, or work under compulsion at the municipal farm for a wage of \$1.50 per day which is given to their families.

"One or two months at the municipal farm usually results in a cure of shiftless men who should be supporting their wives or mothers," Mrs. Foster said.

During her residence in Omaha Mrs. Foster was a charter member of Clifton Hill Presbyterian church.

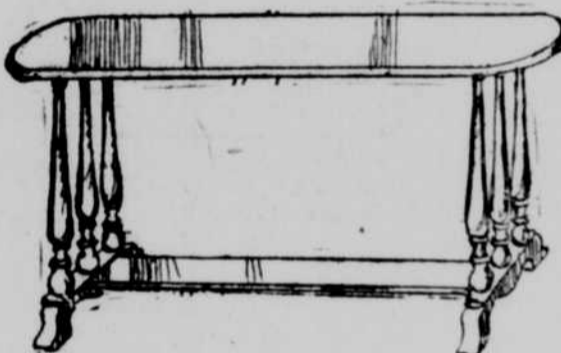

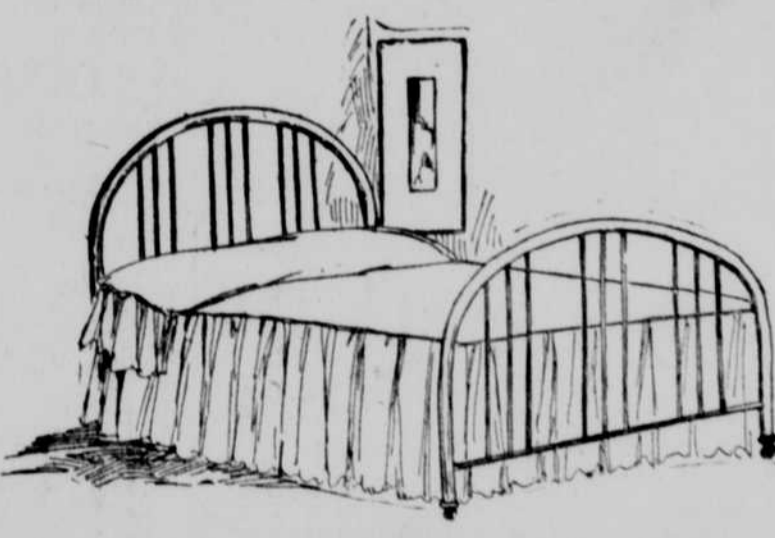
