Red Sox Trim Senators, 13-1, in Season Final

Nick Altrock Scores Washington's Single Run—Boston Finishes Season in Seventh Place.

BOSTON, Sept. 30.—Boston finished in seventh place today by beating the pennant-winning Washington Senators, 13 to 1, in a game which showed that the latter harbored no grudge against Boston for having delayed the finish by taking the first of the final series here.

Nick Altrock, Washington's clown-coach, delighted the fans by holding the home team to one run while he had possession of the mound for the final two innings, and then capped the day by sending the lone Washington run after hitting a "remarkable" three-bagger.
