

Chekiang Troops Repulse Attack

Counter-offensive on Part of Kiangsu Forces Results in Failure.

Shanghai, Sept. 30.—The fourth day of continuous fighting between rival Chinese armies near Shanghai was completed tonight, with no evidence that early termination of the battle could be expected.

Shanghai, Sept. 30.—Heavy counter attacks made by the invading Kiangsu forces throughout last night in the Malo and Kiating sectors west of Shanghai, have all been repulsed, according to the military headquarters of the defending Chekiang armies at Lungwha.

The Chekiang forces, said the Lungwha announcement today, are holding the new ground gained, but were making no attempt this morning to effect further advances into the territory held by the invaders.

Upward of 500 wounded Chekiang soldiers were brought into Shanghai today and the reported losses on the Kiangsu side were even greater.

Engagements of lesser importance took place last night and were continuing today near Liubo and Hwangtu.

The Chekiang headquarters at Lungwha is momentarily expecting Kiangsu attacks to be launched against its lines of defense southwest of Shanghai beyond Sungkiang, where the Chekiang army numbers 5,000.

NEW HIGH PRICES FOR LIVESTOCK

Cattle and hogs set new high prices for September in sales at the South Omaha markets Tuesday morning. The top price for cattle was \$11.25 and for hogs \$10.30 per hundred.

The run of hogs for the past month was the largest for any September in the history of the South Omaha yards. Receipts for this September have totaled 201,700, which is considerably higher than in any previous year. Receipts Tuesday were 7,000, and trading was brisk at an advance of 10 to 15 cents for all classifications.

House Considers Boundary Tangle

Asquith Pledges Support of Liberals to Government Measure.

London, Sept. 30.—Prime Minister MacDonald moved second reading in the house of commons today of the bill providing for the creation of an Irish boundary commission without the participation of Ulster.

In making the motion the premier declared it was the essential duty of every government to fulfill its obligations. He said he resented the charge that the government's move was an attempt to coerce Ulster.

Herbert Asquith, former premier and liberal leader, declared that the liberals would give the Irish bill their hearty and undivided support.

Mr. MacDonald contended that whatever government might be in power would find no other possible course than the one he had been pursuing.

After reviewing the events leading up to the anglo-Irish treaty a vital part of which was the adjustment of boundary between Ulster and the free state, he said that the important machinery for the boundary adjustment was faulty and that, in consequence the whole agreement was jeopardized. The government now was simply seeking to find a remedy for the original defect.

U. S. STANDS PAT ON WAR DEBTS

Washington, Sept. 30.—There has been no change in this government's attitude toward collecting the war-time debts owed by foreign governments, President Coolidge told callers at the White House today.

The statement of the government's position was called forth by renewed discussion in European capitals concerning possible cancellation of the debts.

NEW PETITION IN HOLMES CASE

An amended petition asking for separate maintenance was filed Tuesday morning in district court by Grace Helen Holmes against Ernest Holmes, proprietor of the Holmes' recreational parlors, 1521 Farnam street.

Holmes is accused of extreme cruelty and having wantonly and cruelly refused to support his wife, although he had the means of supporting her at his command.

The petition for separate maintenance was first filed several weeks ago. After a preliminary hearing the court ordered an amended petition filed. The amended petition was filed in accordance with this order.

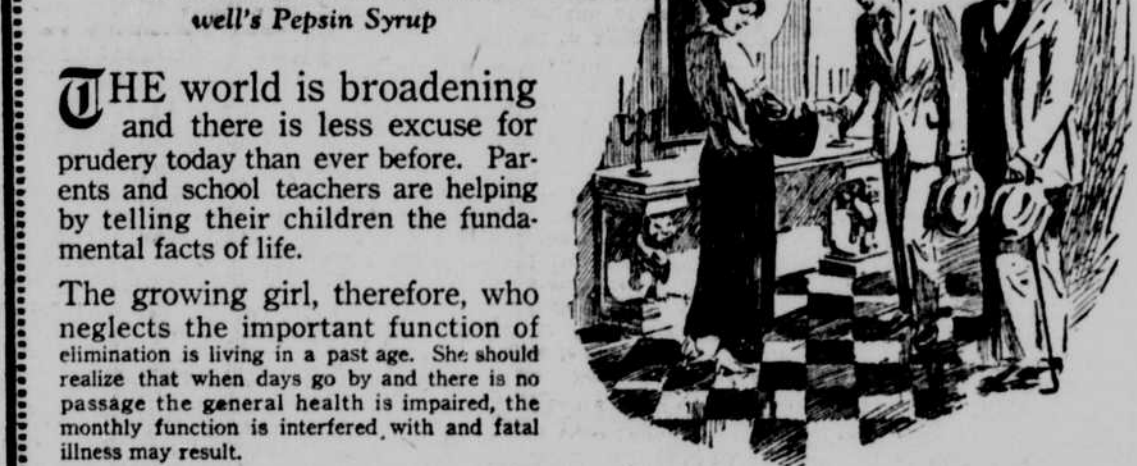
