Edward Bell, born in August, 1882, was one of the experts and secretaries attached to the American delegation at the armament limitation conference in Washington in 1921 and also acted as American observer at the conversations between the Chinese Japanese representatives in regard to the Shantung question.

He went to Pekin two years ago as counsellor of the embassy from Washington where he was chief of the division of current information in the State department. His diplo matic service included posts in London where he was secretary to the Persia and Cuba. His home was in
