

SOUTH OMAHA PEKLO INSURANCE PAID TO FATHER SCHOOL THEFT SUSPECT HELD

Payment Follows Decision of Investigators That Auditor Was Murdered.

An aftermath of the mysterious death of the late Frank Peklo, 5209 South Twentieth street, occurred Friday when a \$7,500 accident insurance policy was paid to the father.

The sum was paid by Frank L. Sveska, representing the Travelers Insurance company. The policy was made out to John Peklo, the father, and an equal amount to Mrs. Anna Peklo, the mother, who died a few weeks before the body was found.

Payment of the claim followed the decision of the company's investigators that Peklo was murdered and therefore his death was an accident.

Peklo, who was an auditor for the Woodmen of the World, disappeared a year ago. Eleven months later a body identified as his was found floating in Pappo creek.

Peklo took out the insurance policy in 1920 and had paid only \$75 in premiums on it.
