Creditors Seize Missing "Polish King's" Property

Washing Machine, Desks, Chairs, Piano Returned to Firms as No Word Heard From Purchaser.

While stockholders and creditors mourn, no word has come out of the void regarding the present whereabouts of Charles E. Cummings, who blew into town several months ago, started a furniture polish factory at Twenty-eighth and Leavenworth streets, rented a handsome furnished home, sold thousands of dollars worth of stock in his factory, bought much on credit and then, last week, on the eve of the "marriage of his sister to the Baron Hans Von Ringhausen of Berlin," departed, leaving no trace. Two more complaints were added Friday to four already in the hands of the welfare board from women who sold the furniture polish at \$16 a week and then didn't get the \$16.




