

Iowa Governor Tries Mush Diet

N. E. Kendall's Family Skimps on Meals to Aid Orphan Fund.

The near east relief fund was enriched by \$4.77 this week by Governor N. E. Kendall of Iowa. Governor Kendall and his family last Sunday aided the cause by having "gold-en rule" meals and sending the money saved therefrom to Dr. W. J. Shall.

"In our household for Iowa," wrote Governor Kendall, "we observed golden rule Sunday with results which I believe are quite satisfactory. There are five members of our family—Mrs. Kendall, myself, Mr. Washington, our driver; Mizell, our cook, and Pat, our dog. Our usual Sunday dinner involves an expenditure of \$5.00 as it can be calculated. Yesterday we reduced our rations to friend mush and coffee for breakfast, mush and milk for dinner and brown bread and coffee for supper, entailing an expense, as we computed it, of 32 cents.

"I have much pleasure, therefore, in enclosing my check for \$4.77, representing the amount we effected for the benefit of the little people in the near east.

"Always best wishes for the complete success of the great enterprise in which you are engaged."

Church to Hold Vesper Services

First Presbyterians Plan Three Special Christmas Events.

Tomorrow afternoon the First Presbyterian church will begin a series of 5 o'clock vesper services, which, according to present plans, will continue until after Easter. The bandit was hit in the back. He whirled about, dropped part of the malt he had taken from the register, clutched his mask, his hat and his revolver and fled.

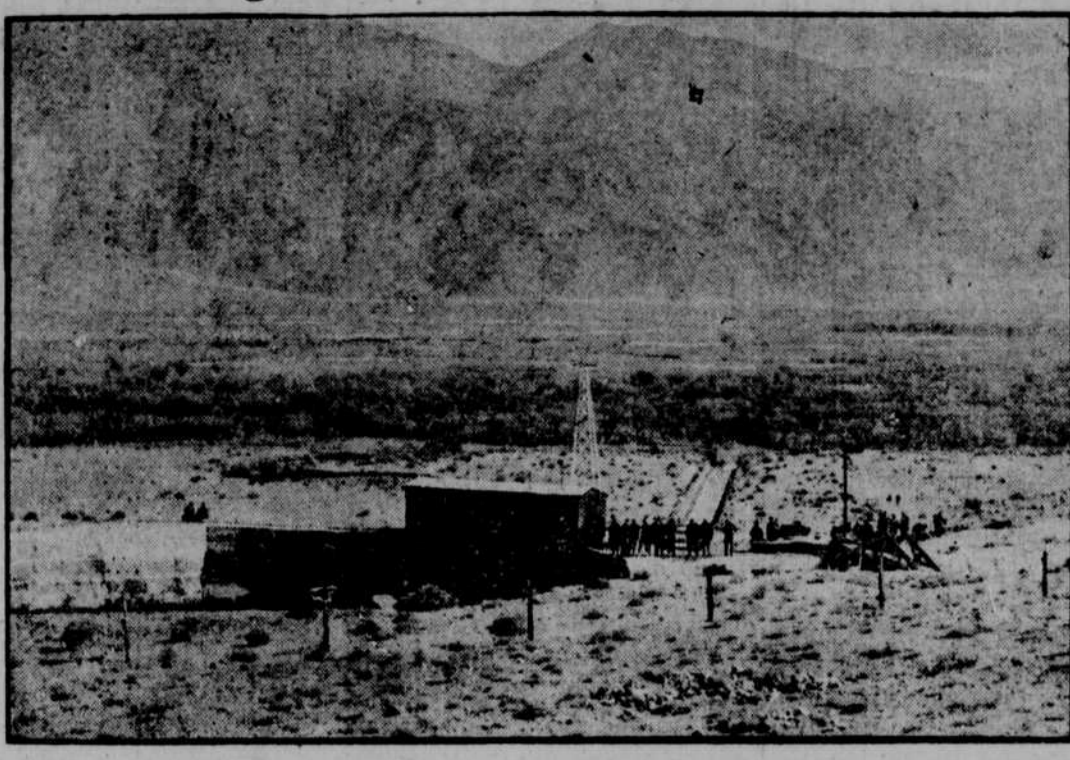
Yuletide Party at School of Individual Instruction
