

Judge Sued for \$25,000 Damages by C. L. Nethaway

Abraham L. Sutton Made Co-Defendant with Plaintiff's Second Wife; Second Case of Its Kind.

Claude L. Nethaway of 8013 North Thirtieth street, brought suit in district court Tuesday for \$25,000 damages, making Abraham L. Sutton, recently elected district judge, and Stella Bump Nethaway, his divorced wife, defendant.

Nethaway charges that Judge Sutton conspired to have him indicted for using the mails for unlawful purposes. He did this by presenting obscene matter to the postal inspector, claiming he had written it, he alleges. The postal inspector presented this matter to the grand jury and Nethaway was indicted.

His case was dismissed, however, when a jury found that he charged this conspiracy as an effort to force him to pay alimony to his second wife, who divorced him.

"Nethaway sued me once before in the same manner," said Judge Sutton, who takes his place as a district judge Thursday. "It came up before Judge Brown and was dismissed. Should this case come to trial I shall quit being a judge long enough to defend it myself."

"I have no fear of the outcome. In the capacity of an attorney I obtained a judgment for \$2,000 against Mrs. Bump, his second wife, Nethaway is taking this step in the hope of getting a settlement on this judgment. He is trying to force me into submission. The truth is that Nethaway wrote letters to his wife which he presented to the postal inspector and which resulted in his being indicted."

Draws Up His Own Petition. Nethaway drew up and filed his own petition. While not an attorney he claims he had enough "common sense to try the case himself unless he should get another attorney," inasmuch as he had "been through the legal mill."

"Yes, I'm married again," admitted Nethaway, when questioned. "And happily married. My third wife is like my first one, a wonderful woman."

Nethaway's first wife was murdered.
