its more lyric and agile members are: Handers and Mills, Lynn Canter, Mme. Fifi, Genevieve McCormick, Bessie Colvin, Paul Markman, Fred Cowhick, Eddie Marr, and a spectacular singing and dancing chorus of famous artist models. The entire production was devised and executed by John Murray Anderson.

Not the least among American artists is Albert Lindquist, a young American singer of whose vocal superiority there is not the slightest doubt. Mr. Lindquist is appearing at the Orpheum this week with Miss Leona Allen, a lyric soprano of charm and beauty. Even the stage hands have forgotten their indifference as to who is "on" and inadvertently pay Mr. Lindquist and Miss Allen the greatest tribute at their command—they listen to them. And when the hardened and bored stage hands "Stand by" to hear two singers, they unmistakably stamp them as being extraordinary.

Mollie Williams in her snappy revue at the Gaiety twice daily this week has not disappointed. There are 22 scenes and 20 musical numbers with gorgeous costumes worn by a youthful and comely chorus. Of course Miss Williams heads her own company. In the leading comedy role is Fred Harper assisted by Bobby Wilson, while other players are Bebe Almond, Ray King, Morton and Mayo, John Mack, Addie Clifford and Ella Corbett. As one of the outstanding incidents there is a spectacular dramatic sketch.

"Rain" is W. Somerset Maugham's bright little story "Miss Thompson," expanded with much skill into the play in three acts. Mr. Maugham, reversing the process of Dumas, finds his literary and dramatic interests more and more in those who move outside normal circles. His play provokes comparison with the deluge, merely because of the familiarity of the theme—the marooning of a number of uncongenial souls in a small space for a certain period.
