

FINAL SUPPLIES BILL REPORTED

Deficiency Appropriation Measure Reduces Estimates of Budget.

Washington, Feb. 23.—A deficiency appropriation bill carrying \$54,426,562, or \$476,874 less than budget estimates was reported today by the house appropriations committee.

Items in the bill include \$20,000,000 for naval construction; \$1,500,000 for a 500-bed hospital at the Pacific branch of the national home for disabled volunteer soldiers at Santa Monica, Cal.; \$925,000 for a new coast guard cutter to replace the Bear in Alaskan waters; \$1,342,700 for fighting fires in national forests; \$25,000 for the public health service to investigate the oyster industry as a result of the recent typhoid situation and \$300,000 for the Alaska railroad.

Cash for Battleships. Of the \$30,000,000 allowed for naval construction, \$9,000,000 would be used toward modernization of the battleships—New York, Utah, Florida, Texas, Arkansas, and Wyoming, the total limit of cost of which is to be \$18,000,000.

Radio Inspections Eliminated. Items eliminated included budget requests of \$125,000 for use in inspections by the Department of Commerce in connection with interferences in radio receiving sets.

The bill provides that not to exceed \$250,000 of the appropriation made available for the coming fiscal year for transportation of mail can be used by the postmaster general in contracting for air mail service.

FACE CHARGES

Bursum and Spencer Accused of Improper Employment of Influence. Washington, Feb. 23.—With one United States senator already under indictment on charges of accepting a fee for practicing before a government agency, the justice department is investigating charges that two others have improperly used their influence in Washington.

The two against which the latest charges have been lodged with the attorney general are Spencer of Missouri and Bursum of New Mexico, both republicans. Senator Wheeler, democrat, Montana, is awaiting trial in Montana, and a new grand jury proceeding against him now is in progress here.

Both Senators Spencer and Bursum, like Senator Wheeler, are accused of practicing before government departments for personal profit in violation of a federal statute. Each denied the charge today and said he would welcome a thorough investigation.

The accusation against Senator Spencer, the source of which has not been revealed, is that he assisted in obtaining from the Department of Commerce a renewal of a contract for the Folke Fur company of St. Louis, for which his law firm was counsel, under which that company handles the government sealskins from the Pribilof islands.

Spencer Bursum is accused by Carl Magee, a New Mexico newspaperman, with having entered into a contract to sell cattle in Mexico and with having approached agents of the War Reliance corporation regarding the refinancing of the sale.
