Navy Puts on Greatest Naval Maneuvers in U. S. History

All forces of the fleets have been constantly at sea for months engaged in training operations. A technical state of war now exists in the Pacific and will extend the greater part of the summer. During the period the entire United States Pacific coast will be considered subject to the necessities and rigors of war, while the fleet operates to defend Hawaii, Alaska and the canal and carry into the Pacific the first inkling of the uncanny scientific warfare of the future.

Smoke Screens Spectacular Features. The success of the final landing on the Hawaiian islands by the marines is to depend on the success not only of the bombardment and silencing of the forts by the guns of the fleet but by air formations.

Decisive Battle April 26. Ten days after leaving the United States mainland the attacking fleet will make contact with the defending air forces, part of which will have arrived direct from Panama, the scouting fleet air squadrons not being scheduled to stop at Pacific ports on the way to Hawaii, as is the fleet in general.

It is highly probable that the sea battle for the defense of Hawaii will be fought April 26, ending the next day, one way or the other. April 27 should find the army forces in the islands strongly engaged.

The actual tactical victory which one side or the other will gain is not especially interesting to the joint board of the army and navy. What the board wants to know is the condition of the defense, the favorable anchorages and just what peculiar tactics might possibly succeed in subduing the defense. The defense of Hawaii in the event of war is a cardinal point in the United States strategy. The islands must be defended at all costs to the bitter end.
