

Fifteenth Annual Nebraska State High School Cage Tourney Starts Today

Champions Will Be Decided in Six Divisions

Omaha Tech and Lincoln Quintets Favored to Battle in Finals Saturday Night; Creighton Preps Champs.

INCOLN, Neb., March 11.—Play in the 15th annual interscholastic basketball tournament will start here early Thursday morning and will continue until late Saturday night, when championships in six classes will have been decided. From 80 to 90 teams, survivors of cage competition in 16 districts, will be here for the tournament.

Interest will be keen in all classes and the tournament management is making plans to handle large crowds on all floors.

Tomorrow's program calls for class A and class B games on the Coliseum court at the Nebraska fair grounds, starting at 9 a. m. Class C and D games are scheduled to start at the University of Nebraska armory at the same hour. The Y. M. C. A. will be the scene of classes E and F, the opening game being booked for 8 a. m.

Eight high school teams have notified the management they will be unable to participate in the tournament. Schools defaulting are: Kearney, Alliance, Plainville, Wayne, Minatare, Maxwell, Bartley and St. Patrick of North Platte.

Omaha Tech and Lincoln High will enter the tournament favored to battle in the finals for the state championship. Creighton Prep won the 1924 championship.

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Spears Invents New Style Pants for Football Men

Versatile West Virginia Coach Believes He Has Improved Method of Padding Knees.

MORGANTOWN, W. Va., March 11.—"Pop" Spears, veteran football coach, who crowded into the limelight some years ago and has remained there ever since by turning out gridiron teams at West Virginia university comparable with the best in the country, is today in the same class with Thomas Edison, Marconi and the Wright brothers.

That is, Spears has entered the ranks of inventors by designing a radically new style of football pants, declared by many to suit ideally the needs of the gridiron performer.

"Pop" is quite an accomplished young man, and his advent into the exclusive ranks of inventors merely adds another mark to his string of achievements. Although he is famed for his knowledge of football and his uncanny ability to weld a lot of raw recruits into a formidable gridiron machine that during the season becomes widely heralded as "the strong mountaineer eleven," Spears by no means is dependent on his coaching prowess for his meals and lodging.

Spears is a physician, and, according to his friends, a mighty good one. He is also a surgeon and can amputate a limb or carve the human body with the ease and dexterity of a butcher skilled in slicing off 15% ounces of meat when a pound is demanded.

"Pop" also can fill prescriptions with unerring accuracy and owns a large and flourishing drug store.

Iowa State Wrestlers Not in Best of Condition for Valley Meet

MES., Ia., March 11.—With two of his star wrestlers somewhat incapacitated at present, Hugo Ottopalk, Iowa State wrestling coach, is anything but optimistic over the outcome of the Missouri valley wrestling meet at Lincoln Friday and Saturday.

Prunty, captain, and one of the best 158-pound wrestlers Iowa State has ever known, was released from the hospital today, having been confined there since Sunday. Infection in his knees is the chief trouble and, according to Ottopalk, it is doubtful whether he will be able to wrestle by Friday. Grooms, 145-pounder, is kept from the mat by a "cauliflower" ear that has grown steadily worse during the last week. With the exception of these two men the team is in excellent shape.

Boyvey will enter the 115-pound class. Boyvey has won every dual meet for the last two years and took third in the valley meet last season. Kurtz, who will enter the 125-pound event, has won three bouts and lost one this year. He lost to Minnesota by a decision last Saturday. He was also second in the western intercollegiate meet last year.

Meyers will wrestle in the 135-

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He has won four meets and lost one this year. Either Grooms or Woodhull will enter the 145-pound weight. Each has won four meets this year, but two of Grooms' victories were won in the 158-pound class. Captain Prunty will wrestle at 158 pounds if he is in condition. He has won four dual meets this season and holds the western intercollegiate title in this weight, which he won last year. Pillard will be the 175-pound entry. He won the championship of the valley in this weight last year. His record for this season is four wins. Lawrence, a new man on the team, will be the heavyweight entry. He has won four meets this year.

Coach Ottopalk expects his hardest competition to come from the Oklahoma Aggies, who have defeated several of the ten teams this year and have won every dual valley meet. Kansas

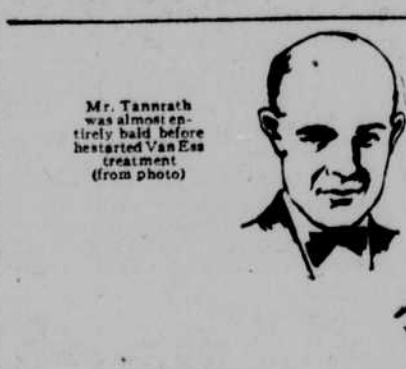

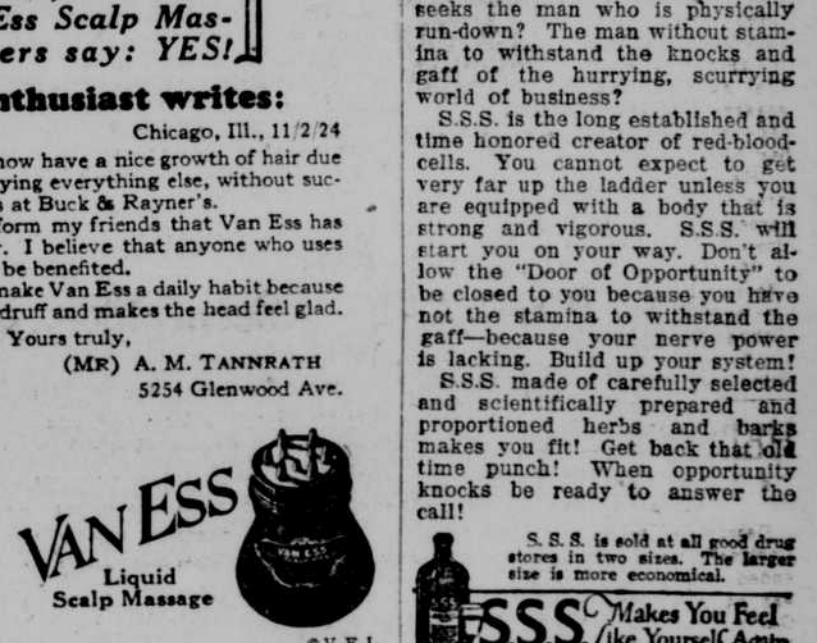
