

1925 Legion Convention Committee Roll Call at 8 A. M. Under Richardson

New General of Arrangements for National Meet Here Has Fire in His Eyes.

Members of the convention committee of the American Legion are starting the day's work before breakfast since A. H. Richardson has taken the helm.

Richardson, who was recently elected general chairman of the committee to replace the late Everett Buckingham, has already held several committee meetings, and all of them have started at 8 a. m.—an hour when the members would ordinarily be debating the question of another 40 winks of sleep.

This is his way of getting things done, and they are being done.

"I am going to start just where Mr. Buckingham left off," said Richardson, when asked about his plans for the convention. "The fire in his eyes as he said it indicated that he meant business."

"Self-Made" Man.

"This convention will be one of the big events in Omaha's history," he went on. "I'm the servant of the legion, and I'm going to do every thing in my power to put it over on a big scale."

Richardson, president of the Standard Oil company of Nebraska, is called by his friends a "self-made" man. He was born in Charlestown, W. Va., 53 years ago, and most of his education has come through reading and through his associates. This has sufficed to make him one of the "big" men in Omaha's commercial and industrial life.

Besides being head of the Standard Oil company of Nebraska, he is a member of the executive and activities committees of the Chamber of Commerce, and of the aviation committee of the Greater Omaha committee.

Richardson came to Omaha from West Virginia when he was 20 years old, and for four years worked for the C. B. Havans Coal company. Then he joined the Standard Oil company and was transferred to St. Paul. A few years later he was returned to Omaha, and in 1917 he was made president of the company.
