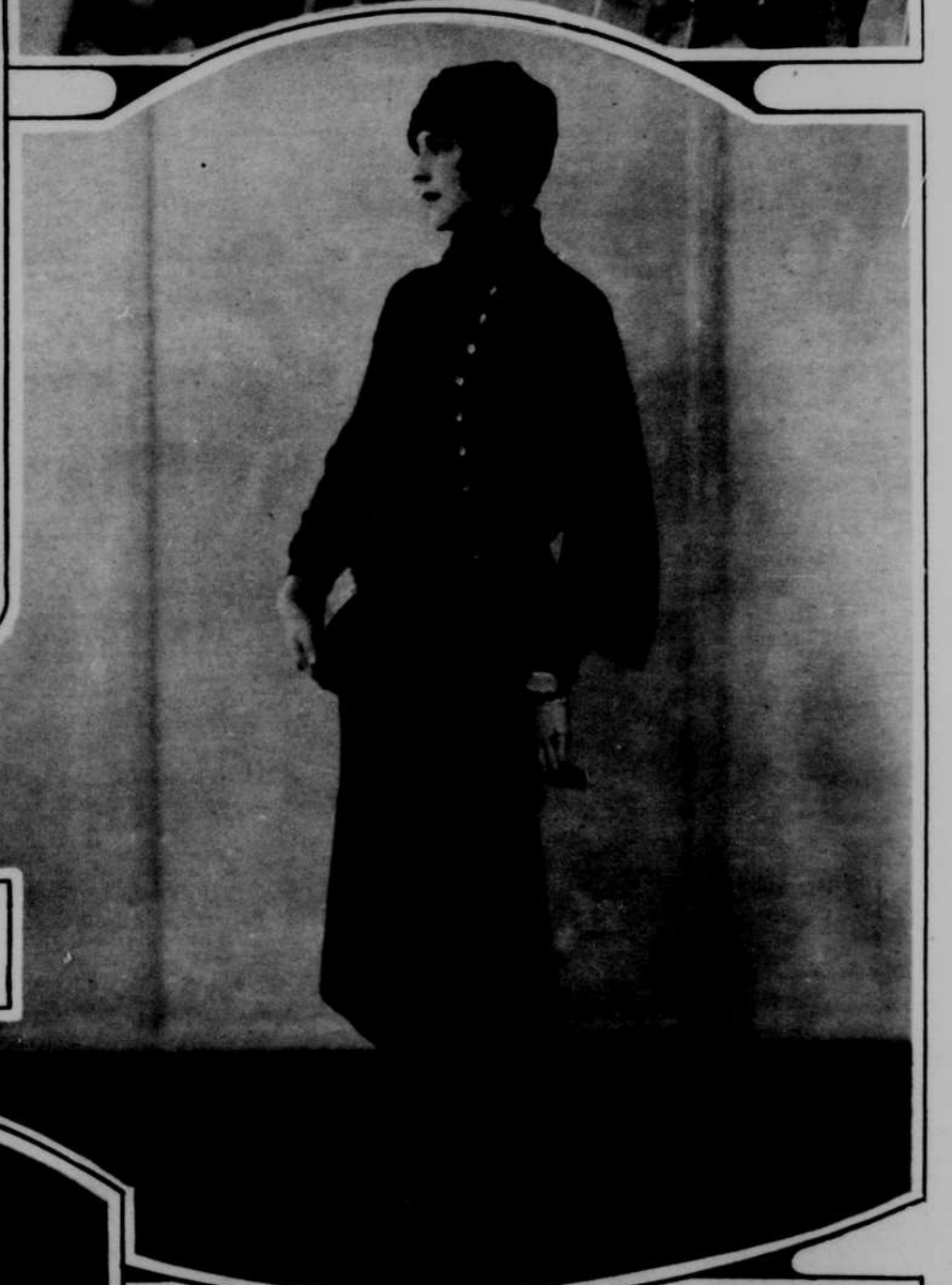
This chic, small roll brim, manish sailor threatens to be in vogue this spring. It is made of all-weather silk and is plaid in design. Note the buttons on the hat.
