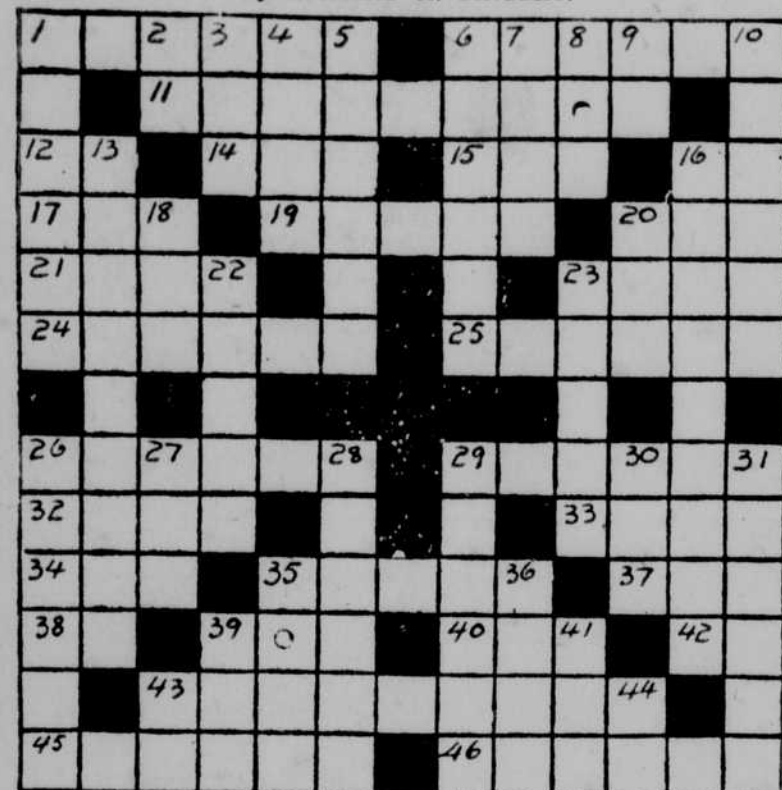

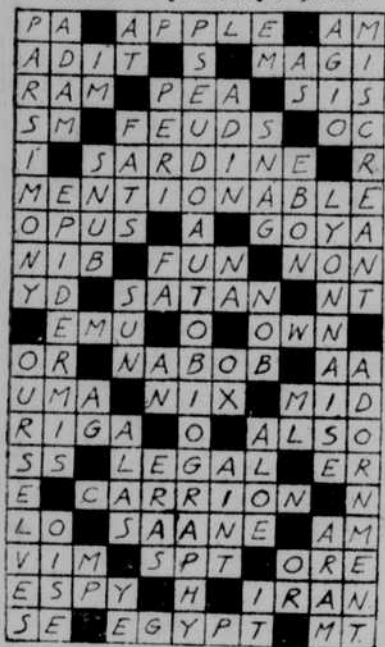

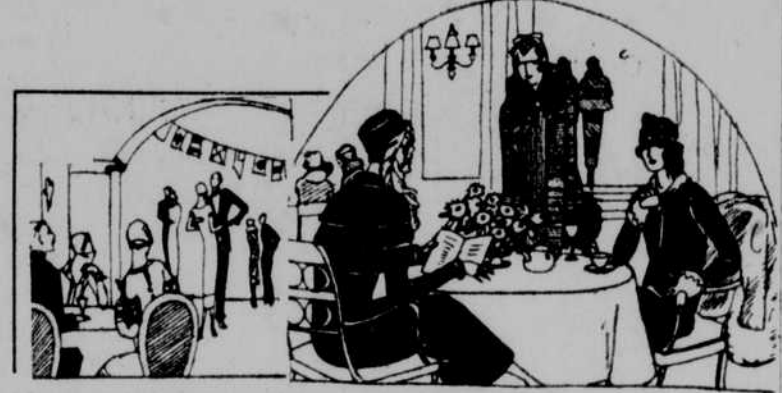
REV. FALLON HITS SHIRKING FATHERS

Fathers who shirk responsibility in the training of their children were criticized by Rev. J. P. Fallon in his talk on "Education of the Child," at St. Cecilia cathedral Wednesday night. "There is a tendency nowadays for the father to spend his time at clubs instead of at home," said Father Fallon. "The father belongs at home, sharing the responsibility of properly rearing his children." "Education is not jamming the mind with facts," he said, "but teaching the right principles of conduct and inculcating those virtues and dispositions that make men discharge his duty to God, to mankind and to himself."

Father Fallon urged the parent to give every support to the teacher, and declared that the work of educating the child could not rest chiefly with the teacher, but with the parents. He advocated the theory that to spare the rod means to spoil the child.
