

LAINSON ABSOLVED IN BARBER'S DEATH

Jury Finds Sheriff Shot Howard Coyle in Line of Duty.

Sheriff P. A. Lainson of Pottawattamie county was absolved of all blame in connection with the fatal shooting of Howard Coyle, Council Bluffs barber, by a coroner's jury at the Bluffs Monday morning.

Evidence offered at the inquest showed that Coyle stumbled on a survey stake at the same moment that the fatal shot was fired, that he apparently brought his body in line of the bullet, which the sheriff testified was fired at Coyle's feet.

Sheriff Describes Chase. Dr. V. L. Traynor testified that the bullet struck Coyle just below the left shoulder blade and took an upward course, lodging near the right collar bone.

After shooting Coyle, Sheriff Lainson testified he chased Mercer and saw him hide a small box. The sheriff retrieved the box which contained a capsule of morphine.

Lainson, on the stand, declared he had received information that Coyle's barber shop was the headquarters of a large Council Bluffs ring of drug peddlers.

Narcotic Agents Kennedy and Larkin of Omaha investigated, but failed to obtain evidence, said the sheriff. Lainson then asked aid from government divisional headquarters at Minneapolis. Two operatives were sent from Minneapolis and one from Washington, D. C.

Roundup Planned. Their efforts were successful and a roundup of dope rings, both in Omaha and Council Bluffs, was planned on the day of the shooting. The roundup of Coyle is alleged to have spoiled the roundup.
