

Buffaloes Stage Late Rally to Win From Houston

Carroll Starts Omaha on Way to 8-7 Victory in Ninth Inning; Bailey Hurls Good Ball.

OMAHA, Tex., April 9.—A rally in the ninth by the Buffaloes after two were out gave the invaders the run which was necessary to win from Houston, 8 to 7, Thursday. Carroll, the red-headed "kid" whose hitting has been exceptional by good since the late winter work in Houston battles began.

Harris concluded the contest and the elongated slinger allowed one base knock only. Four walks in the first inning gave the Buffaloes one run and seven hits in the third gave them four more.

Compton's error on Griggs' fly and singles by Monroe, Wilder and Bailey produced two more in the sixth. Young Bib Wedge, who has been a star in local semi-pro and amateur circles for the last two seasons, has been signed by Barney Burch and is in uniform Thursday. Wedge is a shortstop and on the Houston sandlots was a fine hitter. He swings right handed.

Wills, Weinert Sign for Match at Polo Grounds

NEW YORK, April 9.—Harry Wills, negro heavyweight and Charlie Weinert of Newark, N. J., meet in a 15-round match at the Italian hospital fund show at the Polo grounds, Friday, June 19.

Articles of agreement for the match were signed at the offices of the Polo Grounds A. C., today by Paddy Mullins, representing Wills, and William McCarney, Weinert's manager.

Humbert J. Fugazy, who is backing Matchmaker Jimmy DeForest in the match, said that Wills was to get 20 per cent of the gate receipts and that Weinert would get 10 per cent. Both fighters agreed not to engage in another match prior to the Italian hospital fund show.

While negotiations have been opened for a match between Harry Greb, world middleweight champion, and Mickey Walker, holder of the world welterweight crown, Fugazy said that nothing definite could be announced concerning this match until it has been approved by the state athletic commission.

Walker's recent reinstatement to the good graces of the New York board, is contingent upon his accepting the challenge of Dave Shade, Pacific coast welterweight. Shade is understood to have agreed to allow Walker to fight Greb if he is guaranteed a match with the victor, but the state athletic commission will have to approve of this arrangement before contracts can be signed. Fugazy intimated he would seek such approval at Tuesday's meeting of the commission.
