

Wheat Recovers to Lose Cents Up: Rye Advances Corn. After Sharp Drop, Turns Quickly and Shows Great Strength as Market Ends.

Winnipeg was relatively strong, finishing 1/8 cent higher. Agricultural buying was early and active, the session every time the market weakened.
