

Annual Nebraska State High School Track Meet to Be Held at Lincoln Today

Largest Field in History of Event to Participate

Three Omaha Schools to Compete for Honors—Preliminaries to Be Run Off in Morning.

INCOLN, May 9.—With the largest field of contestants—50 teams represented by 468 athletes—the annual state high school track meet gets under way at Memorial stadium field this morning. Preliminaries in the field events will be run off in the morning with the afternoon program starting at 1:30.

Go to the winners, silver to seconds and bronze to third place winners. Team winners of each group will get a 15-inch bronze cast of "winged mercury."

The three classes are based on enrollment. Schools with less than 100 are in class one. Schools with 100 to 200 are in class two and those with enrollments of over 200 are placed in class three.
