Hundreds of Nebraska devotees of rod and gun need not mourn this year because lack of time or funds prevents a distant journey for indulgence in their favorite and health-giving sports.

Within the state's confines, in north and west Nebraska, are numerous lakes and streams abounding in fresh water fish of nearly all kinds and vast fields which are the homes and breeding places of many species of wild game fowl.

A few hours' journey from Omaha brings one to the towns which border on or are in the heart of the fish and game country.

For the motorist any of the several highways out of Omaha and Lincoln are good to Norfolk, and from there the Black Hills trail and the Blue Pole highway, which for the remainder of the distance practically are one, should be taken.

At Newport and Bassett the fish and game country really begins, and from these towns on it is good well up to the west state line.
