

### Jap Diet Regrets Exclusion Action

Claims Immigration Bill Violates Spirit of "Gentleman's Agreement."

Tokio, May 24.—A meeting tonight of the leaders of every party in the upper and lower houses of the diet, including several former cabinet ministers and members of the nobility, passed a resolution expressing regret at the passage by the American congress of the Japanese exclusion provision of the immigration bill and their resolve to use their efforts to restrain the resentment of the people.

The resolution says: "Whereas, Completely disregarding the history and spirit of the gentleman's agreement, which Japan announced its willingness to modify if the United States desired it, congress has passed an immigration bill deeply injuring the national pride and susceptibilities resolved, we, members of both houses of the diet, record our profound sorrow that congress by its action should have attacked so harshly the cordiality of relations between Japan and America; further resolved that, although public temper in Japan has remained calm it might give way to feelings of natural resentment, it shall be our policy to do everything we can to restrain an intemperate exhibition and in this resolve we are supported by the hope that means may still be found to check the enactment of the bill into law."

The couple eloped to Sidney several months ago and at the request of the parents and her grandfather, president of a Lincoln bank, the marriage was annulled when the bride told the court she did not remember what occurred at Sidney and that she did not plan to get married. The couple were remarried last week in California. The parents and the grandfather were present at this ceremony.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon, conducted by Bishop Beecher of Hastings, who officiated at the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Bassett, as well as having christened their children and grandchildren. Mr. Bassett was a member of the Masonic lodge and of the A. O. U. W.
