This recommendation was made to This recommendation was made to the executive committee of the Chamber Wednesday noon by Victor B. Smith, chairman of the traffic committee, and the executive committee promptly acted in favor of the signals. found during the last few weeks of the trial that more than 80 per cent of the drivers pay strict attention to the stop and go signals," says Mr. Smith. "We made no specific recommendations as to the type of signal to be installed. The cost of installing them is a matter that is difficult to determine just now, but we find that the salary of one traffic officer for a year will pay for the installation of three signals."
