

### Rain Torrents All Over City; More Sunday

Total of 1.22 Inches Recorded; 21 Successive Days of Subnormal Temperature Here.

Bluffs Creek Out Again. The heavy rain of Saturday morning caused Indian creek in Council Bluffs to rise by leaps until, at noon, it was overflowing its banks at some places.

More Showers Coming. One-third of an inch of rain fell in Omaha up to 7 Saturday morning, the weather bureau reported.

Water washed under the brick paving at Twenty-eighth, Avenue and Turner boulevard and destroyed two sections several yards square.

On Twenty-seventh street, south of California street, half a block was under a foot of water for some time after the rain ceased.

Broken Bow, Neb., June 7.—More than two inches of rain fell here. Lightning struck Charles Melham's barn, setting it on fire.

Beatrice, Neb., June 7.—Showers fell in this section of Nebraska today following which there was a sudden drop in temperature.

### Loeb Accuses Leopold of Death Blow

Confession Made in Writing to State's Attorney by 'Weakling' Released for Publication Today.

Chicago, June 7.—All the blame for the murder of Robert Franks is placed upon Nathan Leopold, Jr., by his former chum, Richard Loeb, in a confession made by the latter to the state's attorney today.

Chicago, June 7.—The typewriter, supposed to have been used to write the letter sent by Leopold and Loeb to Mr. Franks, was found in the lagoon at Jackson park late today.

Loeb, in his confession, says that the "plan was broached by Leopold as a means of excitement and adventure and to obtain money."

There was a rumor current here today that a young lady friend of Loeb's had been arrested, but the facts developed that a reporter on a local newspaper had taken two policemen with him to the home of the young lady and interviewed her but she was not placed in custody.
