THE GAME WITH OXFORD.

McCook demonstrated her baseball superiority over Oxford Saturday afternoon by pouncing two of her pitchers over the lot for a total of thirteen hits and winning by a score of 16 to 6. The features of the game were the pitching of Dorwart for McCook and the excellent batting of Culbertson, Amsden and Dorwart. Culbertson getting a home run 2 three-baggers and a double in four times at bat.

The McCook high school has a team that is far above the average and should receive more patronage than they are now receiving.

McCook—C. Emerson out Thuline to Burt. O'Brien hit to center for 2 bases. F. Emerson went to first on Burt's error but was caught off the base. Culbertson hit for a home run scoring O'Brien. Dorwart out on grounder to Burt. Two hits, 2 runs.

Third Inning.

Oxford—Lueking out Dorwart to Amsden. Divan out F. Emerson to Amsden. Hollinger was hit by Dorwart and stole second. Burt hit safely to right field scoring Hollinger. Burt going to third on O'Brien's wild throw to the plate. Thuline was hit

by Dorwart. McMurrin out on fly to C. Emerson. One hit, 1 run.

McCook—Gray out Bailey to Burt. and went to second on a wild pitch and was sacrificed to third by Knowles. Amsden out on fly to Lueking. One hit, no runs.

Dorwart went to second on Lewis' error, Culbertson scoring. Gray hit for one base, scoring Dorwart. Schwab hit to center for one base. Knowles out Lueking to Burt. Amsden hit for 4 bases scoring Gray and Dorwart ahead of himself. C. Emerson received his second pass this inning by getting a base on balls and stole second and third. O'Brien out Bailey to Burt. Four hits, 7 runs.

Fifth Inning.

Oxford—Hollinger hit for 3 bases. Burt struck out. Thuline out on fly to Culbertson. McMurrin out Schwab to Amsden. One hit, no runs.

McCook—Lueking now pitching for Oxford—F. Emerson was passed on 4 balls and stole second and went to third on Culbertson's sacrifice. Dorwart went to first on fielder's choice F. Emerson scoring. Gray struck out. Schwab out McMurrin to Burt. No hits, one run.

Sixth Inning.

Oxford—Lewis out on fly to Gray. Bender took first on Gray's error. Bailey hit to center for one base. Lueking out Dorwart to Amsden. Divan out on fly to Schwab. Bender

and Bailey both dying on bases. McCook—Knowles passed on 4 balls and stole second. Amsden hit for 2 bases scoring Knowles. C. Emerson out on fly to Lewis. O'Brien took first on McMurrin's error Amsden scoring. O'Brien went to third on E. Emerson's sacrifice. Culbertson hit for 3 bases scoring O'Brien. Dorwart hit for 2 bases scoring Culbertson.
