REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION.

The republican electors of the State of Nebraska are invited to send delegates from the several counties to meet in convention at Lincoln, Wednesday, October 14, 1885, at 7 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for one associate justice of the supreme court and for two members of the board of regents, and to perform such other business as may be presented to the convention.

THE APPOINTMENT.

The several counties are entitled to representation as follows, being based upon the vote cast for E. P. Roggen, secretary of state, giving one delegate to each newly organized county and one for every one hundred and fifty votes and the major fraction thereof:
