

Firing Heard at Estcourt in the Direction of Colenso.

ENGLAND IS FILLED WITH HOPE.

Grows More Optimistic Over the Present Outlook In South Africa-Reinforcements Now on the Way to Ladysmith to Extricate General White.

ESTCOURT, Natal, Nov. 9.-Firing was heard vesterday morning in the direction of Colenso, from which it is believed the Boers have resumed the bombardment of Ladysmith.

Colesburg, Nov. 9.-It is reported that 2,000 Boers have left Pretoria and are going to protect the southern border of the Orange Free State. They are said to be accompanied by a large contingent of German artillery, with quick-firing guns of heavy caliber.

LONDON, Nov. 9 .- To the eyes of military experts the darkest page of the war is now being written. But even that is being illuminated with bright passages, such as General White's victorious sorties. If he can keep the British flag flying over Ladysmith until he is relieved the campaign will turn a fresh page, and with the advent of General Buller's force the British public is promised more cheerful reading. The feeling of relief inspired by recent good tidings is nevertheless tinged by a certain anxiety lest General White may again make some fatal miscalculation. The most interesting news today is a telegram from Estcourt announcing the departure of a strong force of mounted troops and artillery for a destination not given. Another message announces the arrival at Estcourt and Pietermaritzburg within the last few days of reinforcements from Durban and that 5,500 troops are assembled ready for an advance to Colenso when the opportune moment arrives. The latter dispatch throws light on the former, and the force which left Estcourt Monday has doubtless reoccupied Colenso, and is doubtless now advancing cautiously up the railroad toward Ladysmith, General White's sortie Friday almost to the banks of the Tugela river encouraging its commander in the hope of joining hands with him.

General Joubert, it is said, drew in his horns after Friday's engagement and contingent, leaving only outposts on the line from Ladysmith to Colenso. The Boers who occupied Colenso about the middle of last week retired without damaging Bulwer bridge over the river nor the railroad as far north as the vil lage of Nelthrope, seven miles south of Ladysmith. Evidently they nurse a hope of eventually using both in their descent on Pietermaritzburg. Meantime the British are able to use both, as they have already done, in running up an armored train, which may at the present moment be covering the advance of the Estcourt advance.

Of the Estcourt advance.

The situation looks brighter at Mafe king, where the Boers are apparently disheartened at the unexpected resistance, a large body of their force having been detached to the south to assist in the investment of Kimberley, around which the cordon is drawing tighter. Evidently the Boers intend to make a concentrated effort to capture Kimberley and their arch enemy, Cecil Rhodes.

Filipinos Using Brass Bullets. NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—The Press says:

Brass bullets are being used by the Filipinos against the Americans. That fact was discovered when a bullet with a brass casing was extracted from the leg of a soldier at the Polyclinic hospital recently. He is now on Governor's island being nursed back to health. The patient is Lieutenant Joseph L. Donovan, formerly of the Sixty-ninth regiment. He went to the Philippines as a regular and was wounded in the leg.


