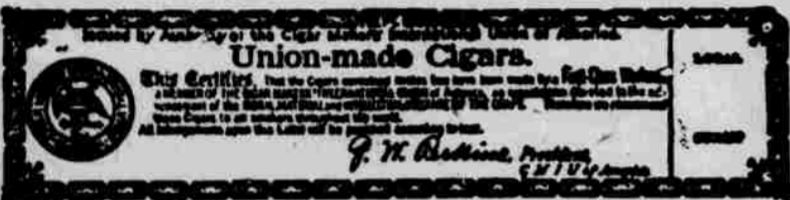

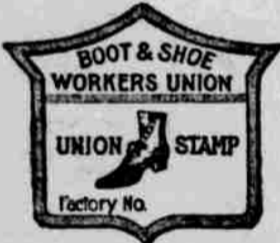

GETTING INTO POLITICS.

Federation of Labor Figuring on Following English Example.

Formal organization of an independent labor party, modeled after the British labor party, has been proposed to Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, by the central federated unions of New York City. The proposition, as submitted, suggests a national convention of all unions to perfect the organization and asks Mr. Gompers to call such a convention.

The action is due in part to the recent decision of the United States circuit court at Hartford, Conn., awarding Lowe & Co., hat manufacturers, \$220,000 damages in its suit against the hatters' union for damages sustained through the hatters' boycott.

HE GOT HIS.

Union Hater Went to Jail Before the Union Men Did.

"There will be no effectual suppression of these labor union murders until the responsible men in these organizations are proceeded against as any other criminals would be."

The author of the above remark was John R. Walsh, banker, railroad promoter, speculator and opponent of the trades unions.

Where is John R. Walsh now? No, he is not running a big bank in Chicago. Neither is he robbing depositors to boost his shaky railroad enterprises.

Not now. John R. Walsh is serving a sentence in the government prison at Fort Leavenworth for having looted a national bank.

And the trades union movement goes steadily forward.

Are we to understand it as lack of confidence in former President Roosevelt when the house votes to burn 19,000 pamphlets of his superfluous messages without first offering him the option of using them for gun wars against the lions and the rhinos in Africa?

IN HANDS OF FRIENDS.

When the train pulled in the crowd picked up Mr. Noble and carried him to the train bodily.—Sunday Morning's Journal.

GENERAL MENTION.

Brief Bits of Labor News Picked and Pilfered From Manywhere.

Blacksmiths have secured a nine-hour day in Evansville, Ind.

Teamsters' Union is growing rapidly in Evansville, Ind.

Clerks' Union in Frankfort, Ind., added 45 members to the roster last week.

Machinists in Rochester, N. Y., have decided to ask for a better rate of wages.

Strike of lasters in the shoe factory of the A. E. Smith Company, Holyoke, Mass., has been settled.

James Segelbohm, a Kansas City, Kan., tailor who runs a scab shop, was fined \$500 last week for placing the union label on a pair of scab-made pants.

Plasterers in Indianapolis have decided that on April 1 they will demand 62 cents per hour, eight hours to constitute a day's work and a Saturday half holiday.

The New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad district lodge of machinists have made a request for a wage increase of 6 cents an hour and an eight-hour workday.

Four hundred members of the Tapestry Carpet Printers' Union, who have been on strike for fourteen weeks in Philadelphia, have been granted an increase of 5 per cent in wages.

The Hoosier stone mill in Bedford, Ind., was closed Saturday by a strike of the employees, who objected to the mill owners furnishing dressed stone to a contractor who employs non-union labor.

In the Saquoit silk mill, the largest in the world, in Scranton, Pa., the 1,200 girl employees demanded an increase of 50 cents a week, saying they would strike if the petition was refused. They got the increase.

The Colorado Teachers' association, which comprises a membership of 7,000, decided in a session at Denver by unanimous vote to send delegates to the chartered central bodies of the American Federation of Labor.

Forty-seven of the principal roads in the country are now using the telephone on nearly 15,000 miles of track.
