

Has it ever occurred to the busy housewife that the dustpan and brush should have a good washing in hot water and soapsuds now and then? Naturally the dust brush is a great germ catcher, and after being washed it should be hung in the sun to dry thoroughly.

A living room of the bungalow type is about the best thing for the average American family. It is artistic, cosy, not too expensive, and has an air of restful, comfortable home life that is often lacking in a more pretentious room.

For a bedroom the best paper to choose is the dainty little flowered pattern, or some plain, delicate color. Only one or two pictures are needed on the walls, perhaps a quaint old garden in water-color, or a seascape.

At a charming and fashionable tea garden the tables had dainty little white covers with deep borders of pink roses. This would be a pretty idea on a five-o'clock tea table.

Charles Dickens was extremely fund of red geraniums. It gave him the greatest pleasure to see them in the windows, for he said that it made even the poorest home look cheerful. Old furniture is extremely popular. Fortunate is the woman who can go into the garret and unearth treasures in the shape of tables and quaint chairs that belonged to her grandmother.

A pretty curtain material is a white muslin barred off in squares with fine orange lines, and five white polka dots in every other square.

Never, under any consideration, have green paper on a north room. Buff color is by far the best thing for that light.

An interesting dining-room wall treatment is a high wainscoting with a tapestry paper representing Italian forests.

A mirror placed at one end of the room has a clever way of making the room look larger.

Save the Rice Water.

When the milk supply is limited for any reason or there has been any unusual drain upon it in the menu, save the water in which the rice is boiled. When this is allowed to stand until jellied, it makes an economical substitute for milk that can be used in many dishes, instead of the real thing.

In the making of cream soups, it can be substituted for the milk, and the trouble of thickening with butter and flour is obviated. In caseroles, patties and many other viands it adds to rather than detracts from the richness. A cup of rice will yield about a pint of jelly.

Almond Pudding. Eight eggs, one cup of pulverized

ugar and a pound of almonds. Shell and blanch the almonds and chop very fine. Beat the whites of the eggs with the cup of sugar and add the almonds, a little at a time. till all is whipped up firm.

Have a pan well buttered, so pudding will not stick. Bake in a moderate oven for one hour. When done and cold, spread a layer of current jelly over the top. Just before serving place a layer of whipped cream over the jelly. A half pint of whipped cream is all needed. This pudding is delicious.

Bohemian Cream Pudding.

Soak one scant tablespoonful of gelatine in one tablespoonful of cold water. Pour on it one-half cupful of boiling water and strain. Whip very stiff one cupful of thick cream. Beat in color. Stir into the mixture the strained gelatine. Stir until the custard begins to siffen, then fold into it the whipped cream. Flavor with vanilla, pour into a dish and set on ice until cold.

As the result of special efforts in the hatchery work during the year the output of fish and eggs in 1908 was greater than ever before in the history of the national bureau, reaching a total of 2,871,456,280. Of this number 2,413,809,225 were young fish distributed for the stocking and restocking of public and private waters, and the remaining 457,647,055 were eggs delivered to state and foreign hatcheries.

Home-Made Potato Yeast.

The output of young fish exceeds the

greatest previous record for any one

year by 376,000,000

Peel and boil six potatoes in two quarts of water until they break. Re move the potatoes with a skimmer and mash them fine, mixing with them the yolks of three eggs and one half four tablespoonfuls of flour and two of cupful of powdered sugar until light granulated sugar, wetting the mass with the hot water in which the potatoes were boiled. When all the water has been used, beat the mass until it is luke-warm, then add a halfcup of lively yeast and set aside in a large bowl to ferment. When fermen tation ceases, bottle the mixture and keep in the ice chest. When using this, pour out what is needed and replace the bottle in the icebox at once, as standing in a warm place will spell it.

When Ironing Wax Gives Out.

The paraffine paper which comes around soap is excellent for waxing irons when the wax happens to give out. It should always be saved for this purpose. Spread out the paper to use it, and pass the iron over it to draw out the paraffine. It will be found to serve the purpose temporarily as well as the wax.

Prune Whip.

One pound of best prunes soaked over night. Boil until soft, Remove stones and chop fine. Add one cup of sugar and whites of four eggs beaten stiff. Bake from 20 to 30 minutes. Serve with cream.

You can make custards of the yolks of the eggs or gold cake to be eaten with the above.






