Co operation vs. Competition.

Editor WEALTH MAKERS: Wishing to shed light on the labor problem, I think the easiest way of en lightening the masses is to put them a few questions Is work or production not depending upon consumption? Is consumption not limited by the income of the people? Do not the wage-workers form an overwhelming majority of the world's population, whose combined incomes represent only a small part of their products? Can that majority consume more than a small part of its pro ducts? Is the Insbility of workers to consume not as much if not more responsible for the agricultural depression than the contraction of the currency? The farmers and all kinds of toilers forming nine-tenths of the population, and their combined incomes being less than half the value of their products, can this nine-tenths consume half their products? Do or can the wealthy, who receive the lion's share of labor products, consume their share? If they do not, or cannot consume their share of products, must not work or production be stopped to correspond with the amount of unconsumed goods? If every wealthy person consumed his share of labor products, would there be any increase in their wealth? Would it be possible to carry on production (or to employ men) by means of improved machinery if there was no concentrated wealth, without resorting to co-operation? Is our present industrial system possible any longer, when on one hand the workers are prevented from working because they cannot consume their products; and the wealthy few do not and cannot consume their lion share, and if, on the other hand, the rich did consume the products of labor as fast as received by them production by means of improved machinery would be impossible, because there would be no capital to run the industries? Does not every cent of income represent a cent's worth of labor product? Does not every cent saved, represent a cent's worth of goods that at some time helped glut the markets? Is not accumulatdd wealth unpaid labor, and the cause of so-called over production-which is really nothing else than under consumption? Do not those who never earn their salt in their soup and spend more in a day than a worker's family in a year own three-quarters of all the crease in wages and interest on the wealth? How dil they get that wealth higher price? without creating any? Is not private property in real estate, means of production and distribution, or rent, interest, and net profits, the cause of accuof the evil-which is private property in real estate, means of production and distribution? Would even a small increase of production ever have occurred if the wealth producers, instead of receiving part of their products for their labor, and been co-operating and themselves? If all were forced to pronot the national wealth be enormously increased? All productions being carried on by means of improved machinery and steady progress of improved machinery, especially the generating of electricity fr in waterfalls in the near future, throwing thousands out of employment every day, how will the wage-workers be benefited by cheaper money for the employers? Will not the employers keep for themselves all the benefits of cheaper money through the operation of trusts? Would the losning of money by the government at a small interest and free coinage of silver not cause an increase in the value of real estate, especially land, to the benefit of present owners, thereby offsetting to future buyers the advantages of cheaper money? Will free coinage of silver create prosperity without a reaction in a few years? Is not the ever becoming fiercer struggle for industrial supremacy between the nations of the world, forcing American improved machinery upon Europe? Will not the introduction of improved machinery in Europe throw three-quarters of all its join it. wage-slaves out of employment? Would free coinage of silver not double the expense of living to the laborers of Europe, without a chance of higher wages, crowded as Europe is and fully developed as its natural resources are? Would not the good times enjoyed by farmers in all the new countries of the world annually attract millions of the European landless? 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

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
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
