JEFF HUDSON DRAWS OUT. The Kansas Congressman Will Not Seek

Re-Election FREDONIA. Kan., Sept. 11. - Congressman Jeff Hudson announced this morning that he proposed to withdraw from the congressional race in this, the Third, district. He said that he had met the congressional committee at Cherryvale Saturday, and had formally declined to make the race, and a convention had been called for Cherryvale, September 27, to nominate a candidate in his place.

Mr. Hudson's letter is as follows: "To the Hon. J. M. Dunsmore, Chairman of Convention and Members of People's Party Congressional Committee, Third Kansas district:

"Gentlemen: One week ago to-day I returned to Kansas after thirteen months absence. On my way home, by appointment, I met Mr. Atchinson, chairman of the congressional committee, at Oswego, and arranged with him for a meeting of the congressional committee. I therefore greet you, and after due deliberation on the public interest and my private affairs, I deem it inexpedient to accept the nomination of our people and make the campaign for congress this fall and I therefore formally decline the

"The principal reason that prompts me to take this step is my mancial condition. All my real property is heavily encumbered except the house in which I dwell. My farms and live stock, which constitute four-fifths of my holdings have rapidly depreciated during the last two years and have been an expense instead of a source of income, and I find it impossible to remain in congress, sustain this burden and remain honest to my constituents. My law practice has also disappeared owing to my enforced absence. The demands upon my official salary from various sources has more than absorbed it. and I find myself much poorer than I was two years ago. I have a wife and five children to whom I owe my first and best efforts. If I were to enter upon this campaign I should be compelled to do without one dollar of financial aid from any source whatever, as our national congressional committee, instead of aiding me, are receiving aid at my hands. (The same is true as to all our congressmen.)

"There is not the slightest doubt that the district is safe for the People's party this year if our people will all get into line and work. While the all get into line and work. money power, trusts and combines, as well as the daily newspapers, are against us, the majority of the toilers and producers are heart and soul with us. And above and beyond all, we are right.

"My only home paper thinks it has a personal grievance against me and has refused to consent to give me hearty support. We must find a candidate that will consolidate all factions, some one who cannot be blamed for postoffice appointments. I could make the race and win, but to do so would mean bankruptcy which should not be required or any one, although it is our duty, each and every one of us, to put our shoulders to the wheel and secure the election of the enters People's ticket, state, congressional

"To the many thousand friends who have stood by me in this district and state, who are loyal to me and the people's cause, I wish briefly to say that my entire efforts in congress have been to redeem the pledges made the people of my district two years as well as the interest of the whole people, and assure them that the sun will never set on a single day of my life without witnessing some effort on my part to help and better the condition of the common people.

"Sincerely believing that this action will result in arousing our people and every sincere reformer in the district into a united and herculean effort in behalf of the masses against the classes, thereby assuring a complete victory at the polls in November, I am yours truly. T. J. HUDSON




