Cyrus Bussey Explains at Length the Objects of the New Order.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10.—General Cyrus Bussey, assistant secretary of the Interior under President Harrison, has been elected president of the "American Knights of Protection," which has just been incorporated under the laws of Maryland.

"The order," said General Bussey, "is a non-sectarian, non-secret patriotic organization founded upon broad American principles and, in order to make it more cohesive and permanent, its constitution and character provide for a financial beneficial feature to its members."
