

CUBANS STILL HOPE.

CONFIDENT THEIR CAUSE WILL YET WIN.

Big Expedition Being Got Ready in the United States for Service in Cuba—Spanish Minister at Washington Protests—News of the Uprising.

Fernandina, Fla., June 8.—The master stroke of the Cuban revolutionary movement in this country is announced to occur within three days. The leaders of the party in the United States have decided the next big effort must be from the United States coast south of Charleston, S. C. They have decided the expedition should be made ready at once; that it should sail from some point between Brunswick, Ga., and Mayport, Fla.; that it should be commanded by Col. Enrique Collazo; and that the fleet should be guarded by three newly built torpedo boats of the latest pattern and of great speed and manned by experienced seamen. Collazo is to land the expedition at some point in the province of Puerto Principe, where forces collected by Gomez and Marti will cooperate.

SPANISH MINISTER PROTESTS.

Calls the Attention of Our Government to Filibustering Expeditions.

Washington, June 8.—Mr. De Lome, the Spanish minister to the United States, has called the attention of the state department to allegations that filibustering expeditions against Spanish authority in Cuba are being fitted out in the bays of the Lower Mississippi river. He also says armed citizens of some of the southern states often parade with arms, with a view to joining some of these outgoing expeditions, or at least to give active encouragement to the Cuban insurgents. It is believed at the department there is little truth in the reports which reach here from the South of the fitting out of warlike expeditions against Cuba.

Spanish officials here are keeping close watch on several supposed expeditionary movements for the purpose of furnishing information on which to request action by the United States government. One of the expeditions is believed to have started from Philadelphia. The suspected ships, it is said, are the George Childs and Bridgeport. The Spanish officials connect the movements of these ships with suspicious operations at Dauphin and Cat Island, on the mouth of the Mississippi.

English Comment on Spanish Rule.

London, June 8.—The Times in an editorial leader upon the subject of the extension of the Cuban insurrection and the reported movements of the American filibusters says the attitude of the American government is diplomatically correct, but that much sympathy with the Cuban rebels is daily noticeable among the American people. "Probably the retention of Cuba by Spain," it says, "is a mere question of justifiable pride and sentiment. It is a pity, however, Spain makes no attempt to harmonize the interests of the population of Cuba with those of its rulers."

The Standard intimates that when the insurrection in Cuba is ended Spain will request the United States to pay part of the costs for suppressing it.

Insurgent Leader Surrenders.

Havana, June 8.—A dispatch received from Manzanillo, province of Santiago de Cuba, announces the surrender to Spanish authorities there of the well-known insurgent leader Fonseca Sanguinetti Guevarra.

Deny Filibustering Expedition.

Mobile, Ala., June 8.—There is no truth in the report of a filibustering expedition leaving Dauphin Island. The schooner Meteor sailed from here ten days ago, but did not stop at Dauphin Island.

SOUTHERN REPRESENTATION.

Republican National Convention Will Bring a Fight.

Washington, June 8.—At the Republican national convention in Minneapolis in 1892 a resolution was adopted instructing the executive committee to reduce, if in their judgment proper, the representation from the South in the national convention of 1896. The South is now entitled to 294 votes out of a total of 595, and the northern and eastern Republicans want the southern influence weakened, as that section does nothing toward the election of a Republican president. Senator Elkins of West Virginia proposes to prevent if possible the reduction of southern representation, and will call to his assistance Richard C. Kerens of Missouri, who is a member of the executive committee. The members of the committee from the southern states will be a unit in opposition to the proposed change, and Mr. Kerens is expected to control the members from the silver states of the West and thus defeat the resolution.

Iowa Democrats on Silver.

Des Moines, Ia., June 8.—Free silver Democrats met here yesterday to devise ways and means to bring their party to the coinage of the white metal. Ex-Lieut. Gov. S. L. Bestow presided. A working committee consisting of a state chairman and one vice-president from each congressional district was appointed to direct the agitation until the meeting of the state convention and to send free silver delegates to the same. The resolutions declare for the free and unlimited coinage of both gold and silver on terms of equality at a ratio of 16 to 1. Weaver was present and spoke briefly before the meeting adjourned.

We can take a strong interest in politics and work for our principles, and it is not partisan unity we hold the welfare of the party dearer than the success of the principles. This question of partisan Alliance members comes to us in every form, and I hold that no one is a fit subject for the Alliance who affirms that they will always vote for any party as they are partisans; but they may belong to any party (yet be willing to learn which are their friends) and be acceptable members. When such join us, as they are doing every day, let us be careful that they do not think we have a partisan spirit. Let us seek the truth.
