nization shall be found in the platform. No member of this compact shall be bound to vote upon its submission for any issue catalogued herein. Neither shall the force of this organization be put in opposition to any issue so catalogued. The voter shall be free to agitate and to vote for or against a sub-mitted proposition of law without pre-judicing his loyalty to the social democ-

racy.

H-No banker, broker, lawyer, speculator in the necessities of life, brewer or liquor dealer, railroad, telephone or telegraph official, nor other person known to be directly or indirectly interested in private or corporate enterprises, prejudicial to good service in political re-form effort, shall be eligible to official position in the social democracy organization, or to nomination for any public office.

I-Besides the election of committees usual to political organizations, there shall be county, state and national councils, composed of seven members each, whose duty shall be to hear and adjudicate differences arising from the operation of this compact, and to prepare and scrutimze bills to be initiated or referred, making them comformable to the senti ments of their special advocates and consistent with existing statutes. The national council shall be the supreme council and the highest authority in cases of appeal from state and county
