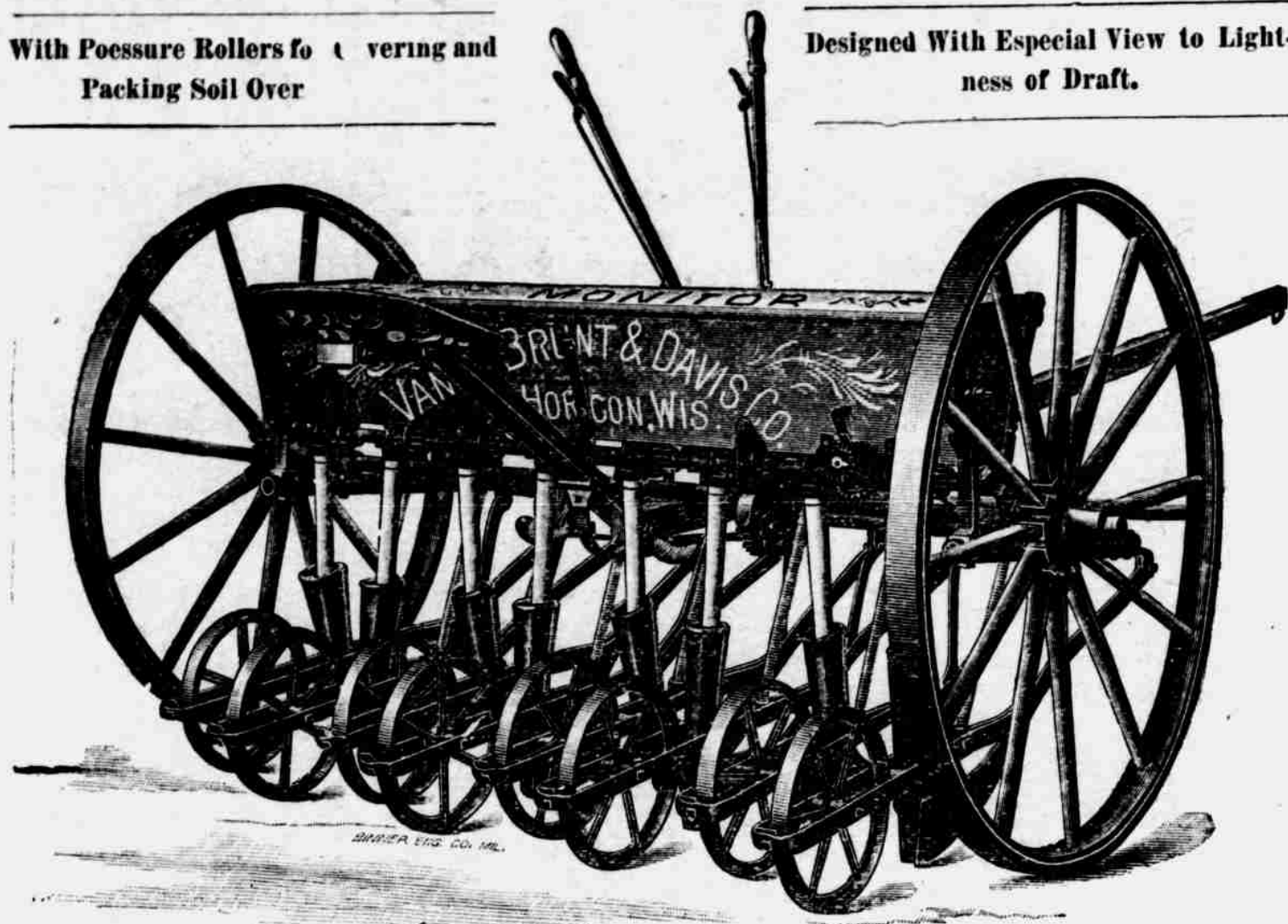
Van Wyck at Greenwood.

THE MONITOR PIPE FRAME SHOE PRESS DRILL,

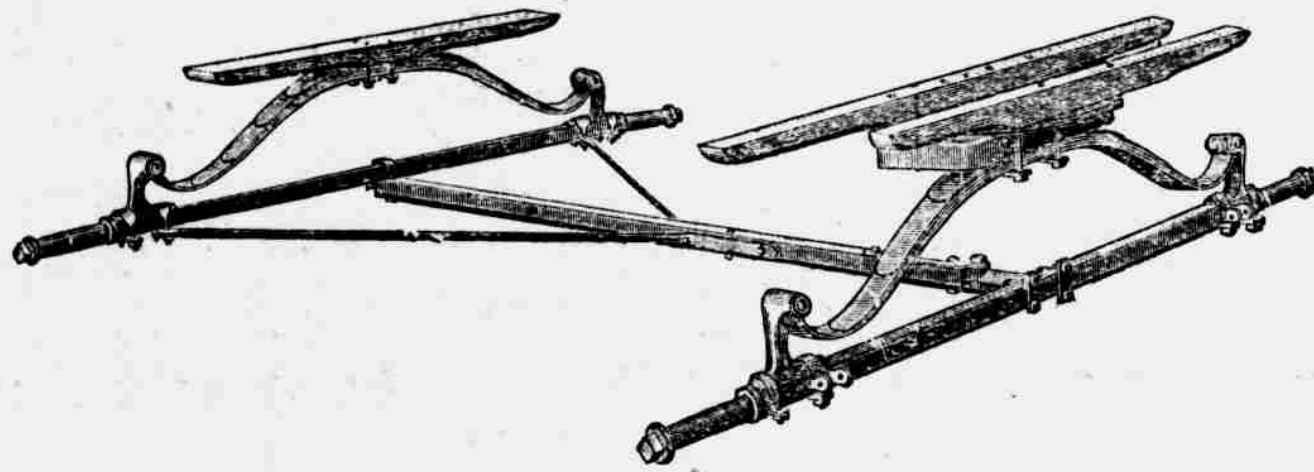
