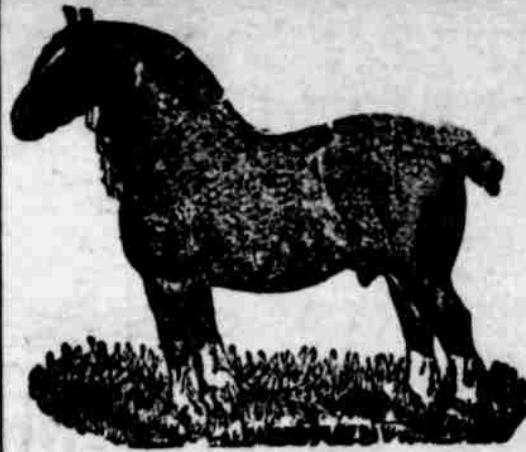
We can't understand why the republican state central committee didn't establish headquarters in the state house. It would have been a great saving of trouble and expense. The committee could have saved a large amount in the way of rent, gas bills, etc. Then it would have been so handy to Tom Benton's oil room, and so convenient for Johnny, and Gus, and George to drop in and talk over the Rewick exposure, lay plans for their election, and drop a few nickels in the slot from that \$70,000 of which the taxpayers have been robbed through their action.

There's a bright side to almost everything. The lying habit of the republican papers has a bright side. They have so far reported a decided republican victory in every joint debate held in the state.
