

man in a quiet, pleasant voice. "Yes, sir," responded the girl, as she threw the door wider open to permit his entrance.

"I would like to see him, please," said the man as he walked toward the back end of the hall. Mr. Harrison was in the dining-room which opens into the rear end of the hall. J. Chalmers, the weathy maker of mining machinery." Mr. Chalmers was standing upon the front steps of his residence when the shots were fired. He bounded down the steps and dashed across the street. met Prendergast almost out of the gate "What is it?" said Mr. Chalmers." The man walked rapidly north on Ashland avenue without replying and Mr. Chalmers hastened into the house He reached Mr. Harrison's side almost at the same instant that William Preston Harrison had found where his father lay. "Are you hurt?" asked Mr. Chalmers as he and the son of the dying man strove to raise him. "I've got my death, Chalmers," responded the mayor. Noticing a spot of blood on the mayor's waistcoat, Mr. Chalmer's said: I guess not." Tm shot in the heart and I'm a dead man," was the only reply. A moment later he said, with a voice which was rapidly losing strength: Unbutton my yest. Chalmers: there's here the trouble is. By this time the stricken man had been borne to a couch in an adjoining room, and as quickly as he spoke Mr. Chalmers gently opened his waistcoat. The front of his shirt was soaked with blood, which welled rapidly from two holes, one just above the heart, the other in his abdomen. "It's through the heart," said the mayor again, his voice scarcely above a whisper. A moment later he sauk Into unconsciousness, and in twenty minutes after receiving the wounds. My Harrison was dead.


