ANARCHISTS AFTER FRANCE'S HANGMAN.

THE EXECUTIONER THREATENED.

Will Kill Him with a Bomb if He Takes Part in Vaillants Guillotining - A Murderous Manifesto Issued - The Story of the Camps and Barbarous Exploitation Told by the Thrower.

PARIS, Dec. 26. - "M. D. Paris," otherwise Deibler, the public executioner, is reported to have received a number of letters threatening to kill him with a bomb if he should take part in Vaillant's execution. It is added that the executioner has become so alarmed at these threats that he has requested permission to retire. The doctors are displeased that bomb thrower Vaillant's leg, which was so much inflamed, shows no signs of healing.

Since his arrest Vaillant has received over 3,000 francs in postal orders and stamps from sympathizers in all parts of France.

Several of the financial houses have received menacing letters, notable among them the Credit Foncier.

The French anarchists of London have prepared for distribution here a manifesto headed "The Dynamitards to the Panama Crew," in which they say:

This first dynamite explosion will not be the last for you wretches. Since 1791, when you converted Paris into a charnel house and massacred 85,000 proletarians, the republic has been turned into a den of thieves, directed successively, by the scoundrel, Thiers, the brute, MacMahon, the thief, Grevy, and the mannikin, Carnot, while the poor hounds below were condemned to white slavery or to die of starvation in the streets. Do you think such a state of things can endure? No, revolution will devour you, we whom you outlawed will come to the rescue of the starving and the duped poor who cannot wait patiently like the labor deputies, so-called, because they had no work. These idiotic and renegade deputies declared recently that you would have them shot like rats, but they decline to be blown up with you. Don't hold the miserable socialist responsible for the dynamite; they only want to enrich themselves like you.

After further denouncement of the Socialists, the manifesto proceeds to describe the bourgeois class, saying:

We warn those who are demanding the death penalty of Vaillant, who followed the knife of Lauchner, with a bomb thrown in the midst of your robbers' cave, look out for your skins. That was merely a foretaste. You inwardly prefer surrender to being blown into shreds and into the air. All, even the most despotic regimes, have ended by yielding to the revolt of slavery when too late; like Louis XVI. and Charles X., who lost their heads, and Louis Philippe, who was beheaded, you, the kings of the republic, will have to yield, when there is nothing to save you, certainly the Socialist flies shall not succeed you. Vive la revolution sociale! Vive la Anarchie!

AVENGING "RED" PALLAS.

Anarchist Cedina Tells the Story of the Camps and Theater Explosions.

BARCELONA, Dec. 26. - Jose Cedina, the anarchist who has already confessed that he threw the bomb that caused upwards of thirty deaths in the Liceo theater, has made a further confession giving details of the crime.

Cedina says that he was selected of an Anarchist group to assassinate General Martinez Campos in September last. In company with two or three comrades, including Pallas, he went to view the march past of the troops, it being then his intention to assassinate General Campos, who was the reviewing officer. He took a position from which it would have been an easy task to have carried out his project, but when the troops arrived his courage failed him. The reason for this was that he realized that if he threw a bomb amid the vast crowd that surrounded the general he would have killed and wounded hundreds of persons. He had the bomb ready to throw but the thought of the many innocent persons that would suffer restrained him from throwing it. Pallas, as the time set for the assassination drew near, urged him to throw the bomb. Seeing that he hesitated, Pallas angrily snatched the bomb from him saying: "You're no good." Pallas' nerves were evidently unstrung by the wrangle and for a time he hesitated to throw the bomb that he had seized. Had he thrown it as he originally intended, he would have killed General Campos, but the delay which allowed the crowd surging about the reviewing stand to grow thicker saved the life of the general.

Pallas, when arrested, and until he was shot under court martial sentence, insisted that he alone was responsible for the attempted assassination, and despite the close questioning by the authorities, he never by word betrayed that Cedina or anyone else had anything to do with the crime. It was this fact that made him a hero in the eyes of the anarchists who knew all the facts. This led Cedina to determine that he would give effect to Pallas' threat that his execution would be avenged. Shortly after Pallas was shot at Mount Jaich, Cedina began his preparations to avenge his comrade's death, and the explosion at the Liceo theater followed.

No Well in Owsley's Case.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 26. - The supreme court at Jefferson City today refused to grant the writ of quo warranto asked for by more than 400 of Kansas City's taxpayers to compel Recorder of Voters Owsley to show by what right or authority he discharged the duties of recorder of voters for Jackson county.

A MANIAC ON THE STAGE.

Brigham Young's Son, Oscar, Attacks "A Trip to Chinatown" Players.

SALT LAKE, Utah, Dec. 26. - At the Salt Lake theater about 9 o'clock last night, Oscar B. Young, a crazy son of the Mormon prophet, Brigham Young, burst open the door of the theater box office, rushed into the theater, around to the stage door and dashed across the stage. The curtain was down and the actors dressing for the second act. Into the first dressing room he broke and stood frothing in passion before Harry Connor, the Welland Strong of the play, "A Trip to Chinatown," which was being presented.

After trying to lock the door, the maniac demanded the key of Connor, crying: "I'll teach you to go to New York and talk about the Danites."

With a torrent of oaths the madman pressed upon Connor while the actresses in the adjoining rooms screamed.

At this moment the property man, Antone Mazzanovich, a match in strength and size for Young, leaped upon the madman from behind and pinioned him.

Just then a boy was passing with two swords used in the play. Young released himself, seized a sword and began plunging at those around him.

Again the property man caught him from behind, at the same time catching the hilt of the sword. Those of the women who had not fainted rushed to their rooms.

BLUE FOR THE CREDITORS.

The Bank of Greensburg, Kan., in Charge of the State Commissioner.

TOPEKA, Kan., Dec. 26. - State Bank Commissioner Breidenthal has taken possession of the Bank of Greensburg, Kiowa county. Its liabilities are \$98,000 over \$50,000 being due to the county. Its assets consist of \$11,000 in cash, \$55,000 in paper and \$28,000 in real estate. The paper and real estate will not sell for fifty cents on the dollar. The bank was established in 1886 with a capital of \$15,500, which in addition to about \$4,000 of the deposits, was immediately invested in a bank building. Inquiries have been recently made of the bank commissioner as to the standing of the bank by persons to whom its stock has been offered for sale.

GRAY AGAINST VORHEES.

The Indiana Politician's Friends Scheming to Secure the Senatorship.

LAFORTE, Ind., Dec. 26. - Strong efforts are being made, it is said, to elect Senator Voorhees and make ex-Governor Gray his successor. The anti-Voorhees movement contemplates the capture of the state committee by the Gray faction and the election as chairman of an enthusiastic supporter of the ex-governor.

It is understood that the silver question will cut quite a figure in the campaign, and an effort will be made to array the friends of free coinage against Voorhees on account of his course in the senate.

An Editor in a Bad Scrape.

FORT SCOTT, Kan., Dec. 26. - In a disreputable house in this city this morning early, Leta Stewart, late of Springfield, Mo., assaulted with beer glasses and tumblers H. C. Brandon, editor of the Lamar, Mo. Democrat and then stabbed herself in the right breast with a dirk knife. The man was not fatally hurt, but she will die. The fight originated over a letter which a friend snatched from the woman and handed to Brandon, who began to read it aloud.

He Voted for Madison.

THREE HAUTE, Ind., Dec. 26. - John Dawson died at noon yesterday, aged 104 years, 4 months and 8 days. He was born in Stafford county, Va., near the birthplace of Washington. He had fifteen children, thirty grand-children, sixty-four great-grand-children and ten great-great-grand-children. He attended the funeral of Washington and cast his first vote for Madison and served in his war of 1812.

Drowned While Working in a Drift.

GALENA, Kan., Dec. 25. - While Joseph Belson and George Lake were working in a drift from a pump shaft in Cooper Hollow last night, water broke through from an adjoining drift and rose about twenty feet above the mouth of their drift. Both were drowned. Their bodies have not been recovered.

Edward M. Field Declared Sane.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Dec. 26. - Superintendent Andrews has declared Edward M. Field, son of the late Cyrus W. Field, sane, and he will be taken back to New York to stand trial for embezzlement of funds of the brokerage firm of which he was the head.

Webb City Zinc and Lead Business.

WEBB CITY, Mo., Dec. 26. - The zinc and lead ore sales and shipments were very light this week. Zinc sold at \$14 to \$19 per ton; lead \$17 per thousand. Shipments this week: Zinc, thirty-six cars, lead, eleven cars; total, forty-seven cars.

Lewelling Asked to Write on Tramps.

TOPEKA, Dec. 26. - The North American Review has telegraphed to Governor Lewelling, inviting him to contribute an article of 3,500 words on the tramp subject for the February number of that magazine, following Governors Flower, Russell and Walke.

How Out His Brains.

MEXICO, Mo., Dec. 26. - News has reached here to the effect that Henry J. Stone committed suicide at his home in Martinsburg, this county, by blowing his brains out. He lived alone and his body was not discovered for some time after the deed was committed.

NATIONALISM IS NOW

Unavoidable. Because of Machinery Steam and Electricity.

NO OTHER HOPE FOR LIBERTY.

Free Coinage and Other Remedies But Strip Leaves From an Evil Tree. It Must be Destroyed Root and Branch.

A Careful Thinker's Views.

Before the introduction of steam and improved machinery there was but one class of people living off the product of another man's labor, and that was the land-owning class. All industries were carried on on a small scale. Everything being produced by hand there was no room for great employers, and almost everybody got the full product of his own labor. Consequently there was but poor show for capitalism. By such slow process as hand labor there could not be a high average wealth, but it was impossible for production to overtake consumption and everybody having steady employment there was no such pressing need as at present. Steam, electricity and improved machinery being introduced, hand labor had to be done away with, and the greater part of the world's producers were forced to work for those who own the machinery. Instead of getting the full product of their labor they are forced to take such wages as the changed condition of the labor market allows them. With every new labor saving invention thousands of men have been thrown out of employment and the power of the employers to rob their men of more of the products of their labor has increased.

As you see, capitalism is the product of improved machinery, operated by men who are forced to work for considerable less than the value of their products. Capital being unpaid labor, it is impossible for employers to exist unless the workers are willing to work for less than the value of their products, and the aggregate wages of all wage-earners not being sufficient to buy one-half their own products, or the equivalent of their labor value, it is self-evident that they cannot consume more than half as much as they produce, and must thereby be from time to time without employment, making a bad thing worse. The very poverty of the working classes prevents their consuming the necessary food stuffs, and is the cause of the farmers getting poor, and into the clutches of the money-lender. Cripple capitalism to some extent, and you take away the inducement to invest; because there is some risk in every undertaking. And the laborers depending upon capital for employment will be thrown on the streets by hundreds of thousands.

Eight hours work, although a necessary will be only a temporary relief, because more labor-saving machinery and increase in the working population will soon more than offset the eight hour advantages. A reduction of hours, not decreasing net profits of capital, no cure is possible that way. So long as the producers of wealth cannot consume the wealth they create, and part of that wealth becomes property of idlers, so long must there be misery and slavery for all the producers.

Free coinage and national railroads would double the prices for farm products and stimulate agriculture to such an extent that the people would force Uncle Sam to irrigate his 100,000,000 acres of irrigable land; and the production in this country alone would in a very few years be sufficient to feed Europe. The introduction of machinery in Europe throwing millions of men on the streets without any hope of ever getting steady employment or higher wages to make up for dearer necessities of life, would force Europeans to emigrate by millions every year to any country of the world where land is obtainable, especially to Brazil and Argentine, because these countries provide free transportation, land, seed, and teams to heads of families. And notice, European food market would be lost through emigration of food-consumers; the emigrants would become food producers, and the very paucity would thus be the cause of general bankruptcy; and all prosperity would be concentrated in the hands of a few. It is well known that the crippling of a nation's paper money, the national banking act, the gold swindle, demonetization of silver, donation of lands to corporations, railroad robbery, etc., are mainly responsible for the rapid concentration of the country's wealth in the hands of millionaires. But land and labor being the source of all wealth, and the wealthy classes employing most all laborers, whom they pay only half what their labor is worth, it is evident that eventually all wealth has to become theirs. It is to be doubted if the people of this country would be better off today, even if we had never had any of that class legislation, because free coinage alone would have caused over-production long ago, through irrigation and European emigration.

Some people may say, "well the single gold standard must then be the best thing." By no means. For the gold standard means, for producers a continually falling market for all labor products without any falling off of the people's indebted-

ness, a continual business depression, with all its consequences, and a general foreclosure. Or in other words the landing of all wealth in the hands of a few.

Many farmers say, "we can't do more and keep our farms." But dear farmer consider carefully. The less you spend the less the laborers will have to spend to buy your products with. Most every farmer, starting as a poor man, has to rent or buy land on time, and so must give, must lose one-third of his labor. The railroads charge robbery freights, your grain products are in the hands of millionaire speculators, your meat products in the hands of the big four packers, and all your necessities in the hands of corporations and trusts, with another railroad robber freight on top. How will you manage to give your children a piece of land, especially when land is getting scarcer on account of denser population? Consider this twice. The production of wealth being in the hands of machine-owners, and production-producing wealth belonging only to the capitalists, there will soon be but a few with inherited wealth and the masses with inherited poverty, or European conditions.

What is then to be done? On the one hand we have an overproduction of food stuff and all labor products, caused by under-consumption, accompanied by impoverishment of the masses, and accumulation of wealth by the classes; on the other hand we should find a rapid paying off of all indebtedness, but soon followed by such a real overproduction of food-stuffs that a general bankruptcy is unavoidable.

There is but one remedy. Stop competition, and replace it by co-operation or nationalism. Under nationalism all leaks and waste will be stopped. Everybody will have equal rights and equal duties. The nation will produce everything that is called for, but no more. No more underconsumption, but no labor wasted in overproduction. There will be no care or worry about notes and indebtedness, no crimes committed for money, no insane through overwork, poor feed, anxiety or failures, no troubles in the family caused by the struggle for life, no marriages for money, nor will our nervous system break down through the unavoidable struggle. Under nationalism all property will be national property, all industries carried on through the nation, all necessities distributed on an equal valuation, that is everybody, will have his share of the national products in such a way as to suit himself. Money will be done away with, and stealing and bribery will be made impossible. All land will be drained and irrigated to increase and insure crops in all seasons. The best machinery will be put in the hands of the workers, to enable us to reduce the number of working hours more than one-half. All able persons who want to eat must work. All superintendents will be elected by the men under their supervision. To make abuses impossible complaints against supervisors will be brought before judges elected for that purpose (and discharges pronounced if found true.) To raise humanity to undreamt of intelligence, children will go to school till 21 years old. To increase inventions and discoveries the nation will provide every man with the means to carry on investigations.
