A Lost Resolution Found.

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 22, 94. EDITOR ALLIANCE-INDEPENDENT:—At the meeting of the meeting of the State Alliance at Hastings last January the chairman of committee on resolutions presented one resolution, not as a part of the report of his committee, but asked that it be considered by the delegates. It was adopted unanimously, same as the other resolutions, but through oversight was not reported. Below I give you said resolution: Resolved, That each voter should be assessed six dollars poll tax each year, instead of three dollars. Every voter who attends the annual election in November each year and votes, shall be entitled to a certificate from his election board, certifying to that fact. The county and township treasurers, and all tax collectors, shall receive said certificates in discharge of three dollars poll tax. Voters who fail to procure such certificate of having voted, shall pay the three dollars additional here imposed, in cash, which shall be expended on the public roads.
