The author displays the three-fold talent of literary ability, historical accuracy and imagination, as well as a glib familiarity with the profane and the vulgar. Those of us who knew conditions as they were in north Nebraska in the 80's and 90's readily put the finger on discrepencies, but that need not spoil an interesting story. It is one of those books that have a flash of popularity and are forgotten.

From the first impressions that Mr. Landon's speech of acceptance was going to be a failure, my views changed as it became evident that a man of ability was talking. There is no future on the relief rolls. The law of the world is that man shall eat bread by the sweat of his brow. The whole American people want to work full time at full pay. They want homes and a chance for their children, reasonable security and a chance to live according to American standards." As this somewhat obscure citizen views it, these ideals will not be attained. under the present bureaucratic government.


