Motion by Reimer, seconded by Carson that Board draft resolution supporting the request of delegation from Page relative to the routing of highway number twenty. Carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board that the present plan with regard to Federal State Highway Number Twenty provides that said road shall go six miles west to join New State Highway Number Eight from the present junction of Highways Eight and Twenty, and

WHEREAS, said plan if carried out will leave Page without highway facilities of any kind, and

WHEREAS, Page is a town of some 400 people situate in one of the County's most productive localities, and have need of a highway for personal and business travel as well as for transportation of crops and livestock, and

WHEREAS, it has been suggested that said Highway Twenty be routed north along the railroad from Orchard to Page or that the present routing be maintained.

NOW THEREFORE, I move you that we ask the State Department of Roads and the Federal Bureau of Roads to consider the needs and necessities of Page and locality and route or maintain a Federal State highway through that town and community; that because of Topographical conditions highway Twenty can be routed through Page, west to Number eight at less cost than other suggested routings.

nice mess of bass. The boys returned OK but they were minus the bass. But good fishermen never get discouraged.

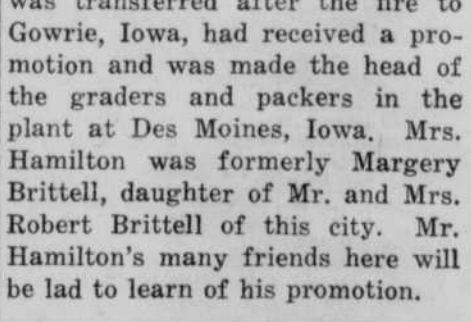
