More than forty years ago Mr. Robert Weidensall, the pioneer of rural association work in America, had foreseen, with the vision of a true prophet, the present results of the then rising tide of the country exodus to the cities. To begin the stemming of this tide, he organized in Du Page township, Will county, Illinois, the first rural Young Men's Christian association, Then, for yease on the platform and with his pen, he labored to convince the association of the need of saving the country from the city. For a long time Mr. Weidensall was simply laughed at But the Young Men's Christian association is, in its purpose, first of all a religious organization, and it finally dawned upon its leaders that the country churches were fast losing out and that the religious organizations of the cities were not capturing the tide pourcities were not capturing the tide pour-ing in from the rural districts.
