

MRS. C. MEAD HELPS MANY

As Traveler's Aid at Depot She Assists 4,106 During Mear.

DOES MUCH FOR ONE GIRL

Youngster Was About to Fall Into Hands of a "Gentleman Friend" Whom She Met on the Train.

"Can't I help you a little? You seem

It's a question asked a dozen times a day in the waiting room of the Union station. Worn with hours of travel, perplexed and distressed, many an inexperienced girl or helpless woman has found help in Mrs. Clara Mead, the Traveler's Aid of the Young Women's Christian association.

There are numberless girls who lose their tickets; who arrive in Omaha with no money; who miss connections and must be sent to rooms to spend the night; who, total strangers, come to the city with no idea of where to go, and who have often made questionable acquaintances on route. They know nothing of the Young Women's Christian association up in the business district where just such girls are beloed and it is only through Mrs. Mead that they learn of the organization at all.

Mrs. Mesd performed some definite service in the last year for over 4,000 girls. She directs them to suitable rooming places; or sends them to the Young Women's Christian association employment bureau, where communication with heir relatives is sought.

One morning Mrs. Mead found waiting for her four children, all under 15 years of age. They had expected their mother to meet them and she had falled to do so. Through the long day, they sat watching the elevator. Imagine their disappointed faces when at 6 o'clock she had not come. There was nothing to do but to write to the mother, care of general delivery, and take the children to a room over night. The next morning in the thorough investigation, Mrs. Mead located the other, who had falled to receive a letter saying the children were coming. She hastened to the station and the family was then reunited.

An Bluxtrative Case. A case which might easily have been tragic was that of a young girl from Illinois. She came into the station, especting to secure work promised to her revealed the place to be a very question able one and, upon Mrs. Mead's advise, the girl decided not to go. The man appeared at the station just then quite insistent that the girl accompany him. He was finally prevailed upon to leave the girl in Mrs. Mead's care. She was taken to the Young Men's Christian association and, through the employment department

there secured work.

Elderly women who travel alone receive nearly as much help from hirs. Mead as do the younger women and girls. One old woman traveling alone to Canada missed her train and was forced to re-main here over night. She had a friend living in the outskirts of the city whom she had not seen for twenty years. It was impossible to reach her by telephone there was a little doubt as to the address being correct. The Travelers' Ald, not wishing to send such an old woman so far alone, took her to the friend's home. The meeting of the two so long separated, was most pathetic bet all anxiety and care were soon forgotten in the happy visit that followed.

In actual figures, 4,196 women have been served by Mrs. Mead in the last year; 285 have been sent or taken to rooms directly from the station; forty-eight have been directed to the Young Women's Mrs. Mead is the connecting link be-

tween the small town or country life from which girls have come and their future lives in the city. Through her direction to the Young Women's Christian associsocial life which result to safe friendships among the association girls throughous their stay in the city.
