COURT TO DECIDE WHO MUST STAND FOR RE-ELECTION

That it will require a court decision to determine which three county commissioners will go before the voters for reelection next fall as a result of the new biennial election law, is the opinion of lawyers.

District Judge Troup in the suit brought by former Commissioner Ellasser against Commissioner McDonald declared that the term of members of the county board is three years.

The terms of Commissioners Lynch and O'Connor expired last year, while those of Commissioners Best and Harte will end this year.

The former two members are holding over, the result being that four members will find their terms expire next fall, while the law provides that only three shall be elected at that time.
