KANSAS CITY, Jan. 26.—The fourth trial of Dr. Clark Hyde, charged with the murder of Colonel Thomas H. Swopes, was postponed today, when, on the calling of the case in the criminal court, Floyd Jacobs, county prosecutor, asked a continuance on the ground that one of the state witnesses was in California for his health and could not return for at least two months.

NEW YORK, Jan. 26.—William Jennings Bryan, secretary of state, paid a brief visit to Mayor Mitchell at the city hall today. It was just a personal call, he said. The secretary came to New York from Washington to deliver an address tonight at the annual banquet of the American Asiatic association.

LONDON, Jan. 26.—Announcement is made here today of the death in North Wales yesterday of Rev. Bulkeley Owen Jones, chancellor of the cathedral of St. Asaph. He was 90 years old.

REYBAUD, the French aviator, is dying here today from injuries suffered when his machine capsized at a height of 400 feet. Reybaud had just completed a flight over Pointe-a-Pitre and Riviere Saint-John when the accident occurred.

BELLE FOURCHE, S. D., Jan. 26.—(Special)—William Cunningham, the Rigby stockman and rancher who last month shot and killed his son-in-law, Fred C. Richards at the Cunningham ranch during a quarrel with friends, pending the next term of the circuit court at Lemmon, Cunningham was exonerated by a coroner's jury that investigated the shooting.
