WATER BOARD WILL NOT MOVE THE WATER PIPE

Whether or not the Water board will spend \$1,500 or \$2,000 to remove a six-inch pipe from Nicholas street, where the base of the viaduct will stand, or allow the pipe to be encased in cement, was a question discussed by the board at a meeting yesterday afternoon. General Manager R. B. Howell said it was customary for the railroad to remove the pipe. He declared the Missouri Pacific was a stubborn railway, anyway, and the city council was criticized for ordering the removal of the pipes. No action was taken, and it is probable that the railroad will be permitted to build the concrete about the pipe. Contractors for the Missouri Pacific have begun construction work on the viaduct. The city engineer was appealed to to force the removal of the six-inch pipe, but the Water board will, most likely, allow the matter to be settled in the courts.
